RESPONSE OF UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 501
TO PLAINTIFF-INTERVENORS' INTERROGATORY NOS. 42, 43,
46, 47 and 51 OF THE FOURTH SET
AND THIRD REQUEST TO PRODUCE

42. Explain any difference in the numbers between Exhibits 6 and 8 to the Miller deposition.

ANSWER:

Exhibit No. 6 is the racial inventory of the enrolled students in each school in USD 501. Exhibit No. 8 shows the base minority percentage calculated for the students actually residing in the home school area.

Col. (a) 9/17/79 represents the base minority percentage calculated for all regular students residing within the home school attendance area.

This served as the base for determining approval of student transfers for the 1980-81 school year. The application period began in the Spring semester prior to the 1980-81 school year.

Col. (b) Net Effect of Approved Transfers - by minority and majority.

Col. (c) Resulting Minority Percentage - 34.3%.

This is the resulting net effect of the transfer-in of five minority students and transfer-out of six majority students.

Col. (d) 10-9-80 - This indicates the date that transfers were being summarized.

Minority Percentage is the result of deducting the self-contained special education students living outside of the home school attendance area from the total number of minority and majority students.

Col. (e) 9-15-80 Total Enrollment - represents the total enrollment of the school, including self-contained special education students and all transfers-in from other district school attendance areas.

EXAMPLE: See Miller Deposition Exhibit Nos. 6 & 8.

Avondale East attendance area had a minority percentage composition on 9-17-79 of 32.2. The effect of the approved transfer was a net gain of five minority students and a net loss of six majority students, which resulted in a minority percentage of 34.3 for the school.

After deducting 14 majority and four minority students who live outside of the Avondale East attendance area from that school's enrollment, the following results are obtained.

43. Provide copies of all of the maps referred to on pp. 115-117 of Mr. Miller's deposition.

ANSWER:

The pin maps showing the location of each student's residence are available for observation by appointment with the Director of Demographic Services at the District administrative offices.

46. On pp. 124-126 of his deposition, Mr. Miller is asked about and provides some explanation for apparent discrepancies in some of the boundary maps supplied to plaintiffs in answer to previous interrogatories. Mr. Miller states that he cannot verify those explanations without re-checking documents. Are his explanations accurate?

47. If the answer to question 46 is no, explain the apparent discrepancies and provide any documents not previously supplied from which an explanation was or can be derived.

ANSWER:

In general, Mr. Miller's explanations were accurate. Mr. Miller has rechecked the different documents mentioned in his deposition, pp. 124-126, and would add these explanatory notes. It was determined that during the 1952-53 and 1953-54 school

years, Southwest and Seabrook were operated under the supervision of Dr. Frank E. Wilson, the newly named principal of Southwest.

According to Dr. Wilson Seabrook elementary school originally served students in Grades K-6 that resided in the area west of Gage Boulevard, prior to its annexation into the Topeka district during 1950. Temple Sheldon served as principal and taught the 5th-6th grade students during the 1950-51 school year. This six-room school served 189 students in Grades K-6. During the 1951-52 school year, Walter Cormack served as part-time 5th-6th grade teacher in the A.M., and took care of his administrative duties in the P.M., when Betty Barton taught the same group of students. The school served 285 students in Grades K-6. The school was so crowded that classes of 40-50 students were taught in classrooms intended for 30. A small section of the basement was used for a classroom and the 3rd grade attended class in the basement of Seaman Congregational Church which was very close to the school.

In the Fall of 1952, the new Southwest school building was opened and relieved Seabrook of all pupils above 1st grade from the area that attended Seabrook. The staff directory for 1952-53 does not show Seabrook to be operational, but the 1953-54 directory records "Southwest Annex" at the address matching the former Seabrook building address - West 19th Street and Mission. Teachers were shown for Grades K-1st only, and student enrollment must have been combined with the Southwest enrollment reporting 1085 students. We must assume that the Seabrook students were included in the official 1952-53 Southwest enrollment report

showing 781 students. (See attached Seabrook -Whitson attendance area map - excerpt from Exhibit Z presented to the Clerk of the U.S. District court September 15, 1955.)

With the completion of the new Crestview school, the 1954-55 staff directory shows three of the six former Southwest Annex teachers had been assigned to Crestview (Ms. Brownfield, Ms. Stone, and Ms. Wilkey). There is no further mention of Seabrook or Southwest Annex in later staff directories.

The Topeka Board of Education struggled to provide adequate school facilities for the mushrooming growth of the southwest area of the city which was caused, in part, by:

- (1) The return of WWII servicemen and their families.
- (2) Increased population due to Forbes Air Force Base being included as a part of the Strategic Air Command.
- (3) New housing needed by families who lost their homes in North Topeka and Oakland areas due to the flooding of the Kansas River in 1951.
- (4) Post-war baby boom and a growing Topeka industrial economy.

51. Provide copies of the documents that were used to create Exhibit 11 of the Miller deposition.

ANSWER:

Exhibit No. 11 is entitled "Comparison of the Total School Enrollment in District Black Schools with Total Black Students Included on State Report and Annual School Census for Years 1940-50".

We are submitting copies of the annual reports for "Schools of Cities of the First or the Second Class" as reported by the Topeka School District for the school years 1940-41 through 1949-50, inclusive.

Several of the old typewritten reports from the Census and Attendance Officer of the Topeka Public Schools to the Superintendent of Schools were found for several of the years 1940-1950, and we are attaching copies of these documents with some penciled additions which show on the originals. We cannot vouch for the accuracy of the data, but we are submitting them as the best source for documenting enrollment - both white and black - for that period.
