Dear Mr. Milligan:

As you are aware, Chapter 94-359, Laws of Florida, gave the Office of the Attorney General the responsibilities of identifying and locating eligible survivors and descendents of the Rosewood massacre of 1923, and of disbursing the Rosewood compensation funds. In May 1994, I was assigned the duty of overseeing and coordinating this process.

The enclosed list represents those individuals who are descendents of Rosewood property owners and who have demonstrated sufficient evidence of real and personal property damages resulting from the violence in Rosewood, Florida, in 1923. The list contains the name, address and social security number of those Rosewood descendents who are eligible for compensation under the Rosewood law. Please process a check for each of the individuals on the attached list for the amount indicated. Because the Florida laws of intestacy are being utilized to determine the amount of compensation, it may be necessary to issue supplemental checks to some of the individuals listed on the attached list.

Additionally, there are several individuals who are eligible for compensation whose cases we have been unable to resolve. Those individuals are not on this list. Efforts are being made to reach them. Once they have been reached you will be notified immediately of the name, address, social security number and the amount in which the check should be made for the additional payees.

Dear Mr. Hanlon:

As we near the completion of the Rosewood claims process, it is important that you understand the position of this office on certain matters.

This office will utilize the Florida laws of intestacy in determining the amount of compensation to be awarded to eligible Rosewood claimants.

In order to be considered for eligibility for a deceased family member's share of compensation, the claimant must present some proof that the otherwise eligible family member is deceased without a living spouse or children. As you are aware, numerous family members have submitted obituaries, death certificates and other means of proof as to which family members are deceased. Where this office is satisfied that family members have been proven deceased, the deceased family member's share has already been apportioned to all eligible living family members. Therefore, there is no need to further apply for these shares. The total compensation for the claimant then represents their intestate entitlement plus the deceased family member's share.

There are several families who are entitled to compensation whose cases we have been unable to resolve. Your office should utilize whatever resources you have available to contact these families. In the absence of any contact from these families, their funds will revert to the state. Enclosed is a list of the families and the page on which their family tree can be found. These families must contact this office by July 15, 1995. The July 15, 1995, date also serves as the cut off date for all appeals.

Finally, each claimant will be required to sign an affidavit and return it to this office prior to receiving their compensation. Unlike the survivor compensation procedure, checks will be mailed directly from our office to the claimant. Enclosed is a copy of each affidavit.

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter dated May 26, 1995. The kind words you expressed with regard to the efforts of this office in administering the Rosewood claims process are appreciated. I am also happy to respond to the concerns that you raised in your letter as well as clear up some of the inaccuracies and misconceptions contained therein.

Let me say up front that I am very disappointed with your inference that I have refused to meet with you. You are well aware that we have met several times on various issues. On the one occasion that I was unavailable, I made arrangements for my Senior Attorney, Guy David Robinson, to meet with you. I have been, as I was on June 1, 1995 in Tallahassee and shall always remain, assessable in person or by telephone for any meetings or discussions you desire to have. In my absence you may always talk to Mr. Robinson and he will communicate with me at his first opportunity.

It was I who suggested that Guy David Robinson meet with you in Tampa on Thursday, May 25, 1995, to update you on the claims process. As you are aware, this office has always kept you updated and informed on every step that we have taken, with regard to the claims procedure. I preferred a personal meeting because I was concerned that family members were not following the procedure that we outlined in March for applying for deceased family member shares and I wanted Mr. Robinson to illustrate the situation for you.

For this meeting, I also told Mr. Robinson to suggest that your associate, Ted Small, be present. As you are aware, Mr. Small was in attendance when we outlined the procedure for the Rosewood families at the Orlando meeting on March 11, 1995. Mr. Small was also given a copy of the letter outlining the procedure. While Mr. Small asked for some clarifications regarding the letter, he never voiced any displeasure with the procedure. Mr. Small also indicated that he would forward the letter to you. Nevertheless,

this office forwarded a copy of the letter to you immediately following the Orlando meeting. Since that March 11, 1995, meeting until your most recent letter, you have never expressed any displeasure with the procedure for filing for deceased family member's shares. I am sure that you will agree that we have communicated with one another several times over that two and a half month period and the concerns expressed in your May 26, 1995, letter never came up. Therefore, it comes as a complete surprise that all of a sudden you are expressing concerns.

In any event, as this office has done in the past, we will work with you to address any considerations you may have.

I will address each of your concerns as you have enumerated them in your letter. The first concern you mention is this offices decision to utilize the Florida State Laws of Intestacy as a guide for compensation distribution. Frankly, this office can think of no more fair way to distribute compensation than by using Florida law. You will recall that you, Mr. Robinson, Arnett Doctor, and I met with Special Master Richard Hixson on July 27, 1994. At that time, the consensus of everyone involved in that meeting was that the method of distribution that would be fairest for the Rosewood families would be a Florida Law of Intestacy based distribution procedure. Our office thus decided to utilize a procedure that you and Arnett had approved.

The second concern that you expressed deals with the standard of proof that this office is requiring to evaluate claims. office is very comfortable with and confident in the standards of proof that we have required to prove claims. Surely, you do not think that it is unreasonable to require someone to provide a birth certificate if they are claiming to be a part of a family. In those instances where people have been unable to provide a birth certificate, we have accepted alternative means of identification. We have accepted census records, school records, obituaries, and we have even obtained records from the Office of Vital Statistics on behalf of some claimants. We have also found that several families have death certificates which have been extremely helpful in identifying family members. In short, with reference to personal and family identification, we have not asked for anything that people and families have been unable to provide.

Many families were able to submit property records to us. As you know, this office also conducted its own research to determine what type of property records are available. In some cases, we found that some families owned more property than even they knew about. Those families will be compensated consistent with the higher property amount that we discovered, not the lesser property amount they applied for. To refer to our request for birth and death certificates as, "a standard of proof which would

be appropriate for sophisticated corporations" and "inappropriate to impose on families", is disingenuous at best. You severely underestimate the competence and resourcefulness of your clients. You need not be sophisticated to look within your family to see if you have a birth certificate or if the family has a death certificate for another family member. Remember, I have had the pleasure to meet a great many of your clients. I have found them to be very intelligent people. What they may lack in formalized education they more than make up for in common sense. They have been able to produce records that by all accounts were not even suppose to be in existence.

Concern number three appears to be nothing more than a misunderstanding on your part which I will be more than happy to clear up for you. This office is not requiring any claimant to fill out another separate application form in order to apply for a deceased family member's share of funds. All a claimant need do is notify this office of their intent to claim a deceased family member's share and then let us know which family members they are talking about. Then, they must provide this office with something on which we can rely to show that the person is indeed deceased with no living spouse of children. This procedure can be accomplished as simply as sending us a letter stating, "Jane Doe is deceased, I am entitled to her share, and here is a copy of her obituary showing that she died without a husband or This is a very simple procedure but necessary to ensure that we do not give away someone's entitlement only to find out that they are indeed alive. The State cannot be so careless as to breach its fiduciary duty but more importantly, I am sure that you and the Rosewood family members would not want to see someone fail to receive an entitlement because someone who was not entitled to it received it.

Also, in concern number three you inappropriately referred to Mr. Small's March 17, 1995, letter. Mr. Small's letter did not refer to the process that requires claimants to notify this office of the intent to seek a deceased family members share. In fact, his letter did not address that issue at all. (That, in and of itself is further evidence that you expressed no concern over the deceased family member share procedure in that Mr. Small's letter was written a full week after the Orlando meeting and even then you or Mr. Small did not think the procedure worthy of mention.) His letter referred to whether claimants who are members of two or three separate families need to file separate claims for each family. You have, in essence, confused two separate issues.

We remain consistent in our position that a claimant need not file separate property affidavits for each family of which he or she may be a member. However, this office can not very well give an otherwise entitled person's share to someone else unless the requesting person asks for the share and lets us know who it is that is deceased. Surely, you recognize the danger in trying to

guess who is alive and who is not, or the danger in merely taking one person's word that someone is deceased without a living spouse or children.

Finally, your letter makes several references to our rules and procedures and requests that we be less rigid, more flexible and equitable in this, the final disbursement process. Let me assure you, there is no need to request that which we are already doing. If it becomes necessary, I can point out countless instances throughout this process where we have bent over backwards to be fair, flexible and equitable. You would be absolutely amazed at how many people have been less than complete in the information they have provided to us. You would be shocked at how many family members we have found that were supposed to be dead who are actually very much alive. You would be disenchanted with how many adults have neglected to tell us about their parents who are living and who are rightfully entitled to the family compensation.

While I am unable to explain the intent behind the circumstances I have just described, I will say that it has proven the necessity of requiring some reasonable proof of a claimant's assertions before that persons claim can be paid. To do anything less would be a breach of this offices fiduciary duty, a disservice to the people of the state of Florida and most importantly, a grave injustice to the descendents of Rosewood.

I trust that this letter adequately addressees your concerns and clears up the inaccuracies and misconceptions contained in your letter dated May, 26, 1995. I remain available to you and I look forward to continuing to work with you until this historic process is completed.



The office of the Attorney General has now completed the process of identifying and locating eligible individuals for the survivor section of the Rosewood law as provided for under Chapter 94-359, Laws of Florida. The nine survivors who have been identified are Arnett Goins, social security number 267-01-6970; Minnie Lee Langley, social security number 264-22-0829; Willie Evans, social security number 261-07-5665; Wilson Hall, social security number 267-01-8111; Mary Hall Daniels, social security number 267-20-4039; Margie Hall Johnson, social security number 222-07-9888; Lonnie Carrol Carrier, social security number 267-63-9220; Dorothy Goins Hosey, social security number 267-22-0048; and Robie Mortin, social security number 264-22-6179. aforementioned people are entitled to additional payments from the state in the amount of one hundred thousand dollars. As you are aware, of the nine people we have identified, four were named in the Rosewood law. No proof of eligibility was required for those four survivors. The process that led to the identification of the other five survivors started with publishing legal notices in the newspaper.

Although the law required notice in compliance with Chapter Fifty of the Florida Statutes, this office decided that it was necessary to do more. Because the events that prompted this legislation occurred over seventy years ago, we recognized that potential claimants could be scattered throughout the state and the country. With this factor in mind, legal notices were published not just in one newspaper but in newspapers across the state. As a result other newspapers across the state and country picked up and reported the Rosewood claims process. This led to media inquiries from Miami to Tallahassee to such places as Japan, Australia and France. The inquiries also resulted in advertising the claims process.

This office then contacted Steve Hanlon, the attorney that represented the Rosewood claimants during the legislative

hearings, and Arnett Doctor who is the chairman of the Rosewood Advisory Committee. Mr. Doctor was requested to send to us the names and addresses of anyone wishing to file a claim. Mr. Doctor forwarded over two hundred names. Mr. Hanlon was requested to forward to us any names and addresses he became privy to as people contacted him. Those who participated in the legislative process predicted that a total of eighty people would apply for compensation. They were surprised, as were we, when over four hundred people applied.

In order to prepare to evaluate claims, an attorney was assigned to the Rosewood case full time and an investigator was assigned to the case part time. Thousands of pages of documents prepared before, during and after the legislative proceedings were reviewed. Working relationships were established with Professor Maxine D. Jones, principal investigator for the academic research team that prepared the Documented History of Rosewood; Stephen F. Hanlon, the attorney who represented the Rosewood claimants during the public hearing process; Arnett Doctor, the chairman of the Rosewood Advisory Committee; Gary Moore, a journalist who has researched Rosewood for the last twelve years; the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, who is legislatively required to pursue a criminal investigation of the events surrounding Rosewood; the Department of Education, who is legislatively required to establish a scholarship fund for Rosewood descendents; and the State Office of the Comptroller. result of this effort this office has become as knowledgeable, if not more knowledgeable, than most people who have studied Rosewood.

An affidavit was developed to assist us in evaluating the survivor claims. The affidavit was based on information that the named survivors provided during their testimony in the legislative hearings and contained information accumulated and reviewed by this office. A Rosewood Compensation Committee was created to review all survivor claims and make recommendations to this office for approval or denial. The office received a total of eighteen survivor claims in addition to the four that were named in the legislation.

The office of the Attorney General has now completed the process of identifying and locating eligible individuals for the survivor section of the Rosewood law as provided for under Chapter 94-359, Laws of Florida. The nine survivors who have been identified are Arnett Goins, social security number 267-01-6970; Minnie Lee Langley, social security number 264-22-0829; Willie Evans, social security number 261-07-5665; Wilson Hall, social security number 267-01-8111; Mary Hall Daniels, social security number 267-20-4039; Margie Hall Johnson, social security number 222-07-9888; Lonnie Carrol Carrier, social security number 267-63-9220; Dorothy Goins Hosey, social security number 267-22-0048; and Robie Mortin, social security number 264-22-6179. aforementioned people are entitled to additional payments from the state in the amount of one hundred thousand dollars. are aware, of the nine people we have identified, four were named in the Rosewood law. No proof of eliqibility was required for those four survivors. The process that led to the identification of the other five survivors started with publishing legal notices in the newspaper.

Although the law required notice in compliance with Chapter Fifty of the Florida Statutes, this office decided that it was necessary to do more. Because the events that prompted this legislation occurred over seventy years ago, we recognized that potential claimants could be scattered throughout the state and the country. With this factor in mind, legal notices were published not just in one newspaper but in newspapers across the state. As a result other newspapers across the state and country picked up and reported the Rosewood claims process. This led to media inquiries from Miami to Tallahassee to such places as Japan, Australia and France. The inquiries also resulted in advertising the claims process.

This office then contacted Steve Hanlon, the attorney that represented the Rosewood claimants during the legislative

hearings, and Arnett Doctor who is the chairman of the Rosewood Advisory Committee. Mr. Doctor was requested to send to us the names and addresses of anyone wishing to file a claim. Mr. Doctor forwarded over two hundred names. Mr. Hanlon was requested to forward to us any names and addresses he became privy to as people contacted him. Those who participated in the legislative process predicted that a total of eighty people would apply for compensation. They were surprised, as were we, when over four hundred people applied.

In order to prepare to evaluate claims, an attorney was assigned to the Rosewood case full time and an investigator was assigned Thousands of pages of documents prepared to the case part time. before, during and after the legislative proceedings were reviewed. Working relationships were established with Professor Maxine D. Jones, principal investigator for the academic research team that prepared the Documented History of Rosewood; Stephen F. Hanlon, the attorney who represented the Rosewood claimants during the public hearing process; Arnett Doctor, the chairman of the Rosewood Advisory Committee; Gary Moore, a journalist who has researched Rosewood for the last twelve years; the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, who is legislatively required to pursue a criminal investigation of the events surrounding Rosewood; the Department of Education, who is legislatively required to establish a scholarship fund for Rosewood descendents; and the State Office of the Comptroller. result of this effort this office has become as knowledgeable, if not more knowledgeable, than most people who have studied Rosewood.

An affidavit was developed to assist us in evaluating the survivor claims. The affidavit was based on information that the named survivors provided during their testimony in the legislative hearings and contained information accumulated and reviewed by this office. A Rosewood Compensation Committee was created to review all survivor claims and make recommendations to this office for approval or denial. The office received a total of eighteen survivor claims in addition to the four that were named in the legislation.



As you are aware, Chapter 94-359, Laws of Florida, gave the Office of the Attorney General the responsibilities of identifying and locating eligible survivors and descendents of the Rosewood massacre of 1923, and of disbursing the Rosewood compensation funds. In May 1994, I was assigned the duty of overseeing and coordinating this process.

The enclosed list represents those individuals who are descendents of Rosewood property owners and who have demonstrated sufficient evidence of real and personal property damages resulting from the violence in Rosewood, Florida, in 1923. The list contains the name, address and social security number of those Rosewood descendents who are eligible for compensation under the Rosewood law. Please process a check for each of the individuals on the attached list for the amount indicated. Because the Florida laws of intestacy are being utilized to determine the amount of compensation, it may be necessary to issue supplemental checks to some of the individuals listed on the attached list.

Additionally, there are several individuals who are eligible for compensation whose cases we have been unable to resolve. Those individuals are not on this list. Efforts are being made to reach them. Once they have been reached you will be notified immediately of the name, address, social security number and the amount in which the check should be made for the additional payees.

Dear Rosewood Claimant:

As you are aware, the Office of the Attorney General is nearing completion of the Rosewood property compensation process. As such, it is important that the Rosewood families understand the procedure and the schedule that must be followed by all Rosewood claimants.

On March 11, 1995 a meeting was held at the St. Mark AME church located at 1968 Bruton Ave., Orlando, Florida. At this meeting, Rosewood family claimants were given a copy of their family tree. The family trees were developed based on information that this office has accumulated over the past eleven months. Claimants were asked to assist us in adding and deleting names where appropriate. Claimants were also asked to indicate any family members who are deceased, as well as provide any information that would be helpful. Claimants who were unable to give information at the meeting were given until March 20, 1995, to update their family tree and forward the information to our office. They were advised that if the information is not received in our office by March 20, 1995, it will not be reflected on the final family tree.

The final family tree that is developed will dictate how funds will be distributed. For example, if a Rosewood property owner had two children, "A" and "B", compensation will be divided equally to "A" and "B". If child A is deceased with no living spouse or children, child "B" would then be entitled to "A's" share. In order to claim "A's" share, child "B" must show proof to this office that child "A" has died with no spouse or children. Otherwise, "B" would only receive half of the total amount awarded.

Rosewood claimants applying for a family member's share because the family member is deceased with no living spouse or children will have until March 20, 1995, to notify this office. The claimant will have until April 20, 1995, to present proof to this office that an otherwise eligible family member is deceased with no spouse or children. In our example above, "B" must notify this office by March 20, 1995, that he or she is applying for "A's" share because "A" is deceased with no spouse or children. "B" will then have until April 20, 1995, to present proof to this office to that effect.

Rosewood Claimant March 9, 1995 Page Two

Once the claim has been evaluated, a determination will be made as to the claimant's eligibility for the deceased's share. In our example above, a determination will be made based on the claim, whether "B" is eligible for "A's" share. "B" would then be contacted by mail as to his or her eligibility.

If it is determined that "B" is ineligible for "A,s" share then "B" will have seven days to notify this office of his or her intent to appeal the decision. "B" will then be given ten days to present additional evidence to support his or her claim to "A's" share. After this additional evidence is reviewed, "B" will receive a letter advising of the final decision as to his or her claim. The file will then be closed.

It is important to note that the Department of Education will rely heavily on the family tree when making decisions as to scholarship eligibility. For that reason, it is important that the Rosewood families be as diligent as they can in ensuring the family tree accuracy.

Finally, this office has worked very hard to develope accurate information so that every person who is entitled to compensation will be paid. The procedures we have put in place have been designed to identify and locate all eligible individuals. We know that the Rosewood families share our desire to ensure that all eligible descendents are compensated and all eligible descendents have an opportunity to be considered for scholarships. We have, however, done as much as we can do. It is now up to the families to step forward and assist in assuring the accuracy of the family trees.

All claims must be paid by June 30, 1995. If not, funds will revert back to the state of Florida. Your prompt assistance is appreciated.

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Rosewood Family

Scholarship Fund; providing an appropriation; amending s. 5 of ch. 94-359, Laws of Florida; revising provisions relating to the award of funds and eligibility; establishing an advisory council; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Education the sum of \$100,000 for fiscal year 1995-1996 to be deposited in the Rosewood Family Scholarship Fund to be awarded as scholarships pursuant to the provisions of this act.

Section 2. Section 5 of Chapter 94-359, Laws of Florida, is amended to read:

Section 5. (1) There is created a Rosewood Family Scholarship Fund for minority persons with preference given to the direct descendants of the Rosewood families, not to exceed 25 scholarships per year.

- (2) The Rosewood Family Scholarship Fund shall be administered by the Department of Education. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for administering this program which shall at a minimum provide for the following:
- (a) The annual award to a student shall be up-to \$4,000 but-should-not-exceed-an-amount-in-excess-of-tuition and-registration-fees.
- (b) If funds are insufficient to provide a full scholarship to each eligible applicant, the department may

prorate available funds and make a partial award to each eligible applicant.

- (c) The department shall rank eligible initial applicants for the purposes of awarding scholarships with preference being given to the direct descendants of the Rosewood families. - (d) Payment of an award shall be transmitted in advance of the registration period each semester on behalf of the student to the president of the university, college, or community college, or his representative, or to the director of the area vocational-technical school which the recipient is attending.
- (3) Beginning with the 1994-95 academic year, the department is authorized to make awards for undergraduate study to students who:
- (a) <u>Meet</u> Meets the general requirements for <u>student</u> students eligibility as provided in s. 240.404, except as otherwise provided in this section;
- (b) <u>File</u> Files an application for the scholarship within the established time limits;
- (c) Enroll Enrolls as a certificate-seeking or degree-seeking student at a public or private university, college, community college, or area vocational-technical school authorized by law.
- (4) There is established a five-member advisory council to review the scholarship awards. Members shall be appointed by the Governor and shall include:
  - (a) A descendant of a Rosewood family.

(b) An individual who has legal and historical knowledge of Rosewood descendants. 3 (c) A member of the Legislature. (d) A member representing the Department of Education. On Saturday, March 11, 1995, at 9:00am, the office of the Attorney General will hold a meeting to update Rosewood claimants on the last phase of the Rosewood claims process. The meeting will be held at the <u>St. Mark AME Church</u> located at 1968 Bruton Boulevard in Orlando, Florida. If you so desire, each family may designate a representative to attend this meeting on behalf of the family.

The purpose of this meeting is to: 1) inform the family members of the efforts that have been exhausted thus far in the claims process and 2) inform family members of what information is necessary to conclude the property portion of the claims process. This meeting will not address the survivor portion of the Rosewood law nor will we discuss any property claims that have been denied.

In our attempts to gather data about family members we discovered that many of the family trees were incomplete and in some cases inaccurate. It is our intent to correct any mistakes that may be on the tree, add any names that may be missing from the tree and indicate any family members who are deceased.

The accuracy of the Rosewood family trees is very important for two reasons. The first reason is that it will assist this office in ensuring that every person or family who is entitled to compensation will receive it. The second reason is that the family tree information will be submitted to the Department of Education. The Department of Education will utilize these trees to assist them in determining who is entitled to scholarships under the Rosewood scholarship fund.

This office will be able to disburse compensation to eligible families only after families are able to develope an accurate family tree on which this office can rely. Again, this process will ensure that this office meets its goal of compensating every person and family that is entitled to compensation.

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter dated January 13, 1995. Per your request, enclosed is a copy of a letter we have sent to the office of vital statistics requesting a copy of the birth certificate for Bessie Edwards.

In your letter to this office, you provided copies of some information that Ms. Blankumsee obtained from the court house in Bronson, Florida. This information does not assist us in determining whether Ms. Blankumsee's ancestors owned property in Rosewood. Please clarify how this information establishes that Ms. Blankumsee is a descendent of a family who owned property in Rosewood, Florida, in January, 1923.

Additionally, Ms. Blankumsee indicated in her affidavit that her ancestors owned forty acres of land in Rosewood. She also provided a legal description of some property. In our letter to her we asked her to provide copies of documentation to support from which she retrieved the legal description. To date, we have not received the documentation we requested. Without reasonable proof of her eligibility, we will not be able to approve her claim.

We would appreciate a response by February 8, 1995.

This office is in receipt of Arnett Doctor's letter of December 28, 1994, regarding the draft copy of the Rosewood family trees that we provided to you for review by Mr. Doctor and the Rosewood Advisory Committee.

Mr. Doctor expressed concern in his letter that there were several Rosewood family members and descendents whose names were excluded or deleted from some of the family trees. It is my understanding that Mr. Robinson and Mr. Doctor resolved any concerns Mr. Doctor had regarding the families omitted or deleted. Moreover, the reason a draft copy was provided to Mr. Doctor and the Rosewood Advisory Committee was to give the family members an opportunity to make any additions, corrections, or deletions to the document. While Mr. Doctor expresses concern that some names are missing from the family trees we provided, this office trusts that he and the Rosewood Advisory Committee did as requested and added all the names and information they found to be missing.

Additionally, this office is not in possession of all direct descendent addresses and phone numbers. The document that this office has prepared consists of information that has been provided to us through affidavits, telephone calls and personal interviews. While gathering this information it became apparent that many claimants neglected to include information regarding spouses and children. Because family members are the only ones in a position to provide this information, this office requested Mr. Doctor and the Rosewood Advisory Committee to review this document to assist us in identifying these descendents.

Although it is not the responsibility of the Attorney General's office to verify whether spouses or children are living or deceased, this office has attempted to assist the Rosewood Advisory Committee in this regard so that spouses entitled to compensation and children entitled to scholarships will be identified. Our joint efforts in this regard thus provides a great benefit to the Rosewood descendents.

The office of the Attorney General has now completed the process of identifying and locating eligible individuals for the survivor section of the Rosewood law as provided for under Chapter 94-359, Laws of Florida. The nine survivors who have been identified are Arnett Goins, social security number 267-01-6970; Minnie Lee Langley, social security number 264-22-0829; Willie Evans, social security number 261-07-5665; Wilson Hall, social security number 267-01-8111; Mary Hall Daniels, social security number 267-20-4039; Margie Hall Johnson, social security number 222-07-9888: Lonnie Carrol Carrier, social security number 267-63-9220; Dorothy Goins Hosey, social security number 267-22-0048; and Robie Mortin, social security number 264-22-6179. The aforementioned people are entitled to additional payments from the state in the amount of one hundred thousand dollars. As you are aware, of the nine people we have identified, four were named in the Rosewood law. No proof of eligibility was required for those four survivors. The process that led to the identification of the other five survivors started with publishing legal notices in the newspaper.

Although the law required notice in compliance with Chapter Fifty of the Florida Statutes, this office decided that it was necessary to do more. Because the events that prompted this legislation occurred over seventy years ago, we recognized that potential claimants could be scattered throughout the state and the country. With this factor in mind, legal notices were published not just in one newspaper but in newspapers across the state. As a result other newspapers across the state and country picked up and reported the Rosewood claims process. This led to media inquiries from Miami to Tallahassee to such places as Japan, Australia and France. The inquiries also resulted in advertising the claims process.

This office then contacted Steve Hanlon, the attorney that represented the Rosewood claimants during the legislative

hearings, and Arnett Doctor who is the chairman of the Rosewood Advisory Committee. Mr. Doctor was requested to send to us the names and addresses of anyone wishing to file a claim. Mr. Doctor forwarded over two hundred names. Mr. Hanlon was requested to forward to us any names and addresses he became privy to as people contacted him. Those who participated in the legislative process predicted that a total of eighty people would apply for compensation. They were surprised, as were we, when over four hundred people applied.

In order to prepare to evaluate claims, an attorney was assigned to the Rosewood case full time and an investigator was assigned to the case part time. Thousands of pages of documents prepared before, during and after the legislative proceedings were reviewed. Working relationships were established with Professor Maxine D. Jones, principal investigator for the academic research team that prepared the Documented History of Rosewood; Stephen F. Hanlon, the attorney who represented the Rosewood claimants during the public hearing process; Arnett Doctor, the chairman of the Rosewood Advisory Committee; Gary Moore, a journalist who has researched Rosewood for the last twelve years; the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, who is legislatively required to pursue a criminal investigation of the events surrounding Rosewood; the Department of Education, who is legislatively required to establish a scholarship fund for Rosewood descendents; and the State Office of the Comptroller. As a result of this effort this office has become as knowledgeable, if not more knowledgeable, than most people who have studied

An affidavit was developed to assist us in evaluating the survivor claims. The affidavit was based on information that the named survivors provided during their testimony in the legislative hearings and contained information accumulated and reviewed by this office. A Rosewood Compensation Committee was created to review all survivor claims and make recommendations to this office for approval or denial. The office received a total of eighteen survivor claims in addition to the four that were named in the legislation.

The Rosewood Compensation Committee considered the survivor affidavits that were filled out by the claimants, the <u>Documented History of Rosewood</u> and appendix that were prepared by the academic research team, the interviews that were conducted by our office of the named survivors, the interviews that were conducted by our office of other Rosewood family members, the interviews that were conducted by our office of some of the claimants, data and information gathered by journalist Gary Moore, the report that was prepared by Richard Hixson, the special master who presided over the Rosewood hearings and information that had been

gathered by Arnett Doctor and the Rosewood Advisory Committee. Even though all of this information was reviewed by the Compensation Committee, the committee decided to review some claimant affidavits more than once thus giving some claimants a second opportunity to add to their original affidavits. Finally, the Compensation Committee made recommendations to approve five additional claimants.

Before final decisions were made on the Compensation Committee recommendations our office created an appellate process for claimants whose claims were recommended for denial. This process gave claimants yet another avenue to provide whatever information and evidence they could in support of their claim. Of the eighteen people who filed survivor affidavits four people admitted in their affidavit that they were not in Rosewood at the time prescribed by the legislation. Nine of the eighteen claimants failed, after numerous opportunities, to present sufficient evidence and information to satisfy the legislative definition of a survivor. Thus, any and all information regarding Rosewood has been exhausted.

As you are aware, the deadline for filing a Rosewood claim was December 31, 1994. No other eligible Rosewood survivor claimants have come forth, and we are confident that no other eligible survivors exist. There remains in the legislative appropriation enough money to compensate each survivor in the total amount suggested by the legislature.

Therefore, in compliance with Chapter 94-359, Laws of Florida, the office of the Attorney General is authorizing that checks in the amount of one hundred thousand dollars be made payable to each of the aforementioned survivors. Please prepare the checks and forward them to Janice Hays in the Finance and Accounting Office of the Attorney General in Tallahassee. We will then hold the checks for disbursement to Steve F. Hanlon, Esquire who is the attorney representing eight of the survivors. The remaining check will be forwarded to Richard Ryles, Esquire who is the attorney representing the ninth survivor. If you have any questions regarding this matter or if this office may be of further assistance to you, please advise. This office can be contacted at (305)985-4445 or suncom 473-4445.

The next task for this office will be to finalize property claims. Currently we have identified the majority of the claimants who are potentially eligible for compensation under the property section of the Rosewood law. It is predicted that the entire process will be completed within sixty days. As has been our practice, we will continue to work closely with the Office of the Comptroller until the Rosewood compensation process is
