

THE ANNUAL STATE SHORT COURSE FOR FLORIDA NEGRO 4-H BOYS AND GIRLS

1953 marks the Golden Anniversary of Agricultural Extension Work in the United States. It was on February 26, 1903, that Dr. Seaman A. Knapp established the demonstration on the Porter Farm near Terrell, Texas. The system of education which was started there has been established throughout the United States and in other countries. It was designed to help people help themselves through improved practices on their farms and in their homes, and in the realization of a more wholesome living for rural families.

1953 also marks the thirty-second year since the first State Short
Course was held at the Agricultural and Mechanical College to recognize outstanding achievements by worthy 4-H Club boys and girls. In 1919 eleven boys
and fifteen girls were selected to attend. This year over three hundred 4-H
boys, girls and leaders will be in attendance, along with their County Agricultural and Home Demonstration Agents, who will assist with the program.

Through outstanding achievements in project work and leadership on the farms and in the homes, 4-H boys and girls earn an opportunity to attend Short Course.

Many boys and girls are inspired to get a college education as a result of the days spent on the beautiful campus of the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical College. The contacts made and the training received during this week will contribute much in preparing these boys and girls to become useful citizens.

Interested volunteer community leaders, who give their service in helping to develop 4-H Club work in the various counties, attend the State Short Course in order that they may be better prepared to give assistance in the promotion of a better educational program for rural boys and girls. County Agricultural and Home Demonstration Agents have a great appreciation for the type of training offered at the State Short Course. They realize that such training serves as a means of strengthening and extending the program and creating more interest in the work.

There are 2,507 4-H boys and 3,487 girls now enrolled in 4-H Club Work in Florida. The theme for the 1953 State Short Course is: "Working Together for World Understanding".
