F.B.I. CONCEALMENT OF COINTELPRO FILES

EXPOSED IN FEDERAL COURT HEARING

On April 29 - May 1, 1980, hearings were held in Federal Court in New York which revealed that the Federal Bureau of Investigation has wilfully withheld documents which expose the Bureau's crimes against the Black liberation movement under its Cointelpro program. These hearings, before Judge Mary Johnson Lowe, were the result of motions made by R. Dhoruba Moore, a former leader of the Black Panther Party in New York, currently serving 25 years to life due to an F.B.I.-orchestrated frame-up.

As Special Agent Joseph Mahoney of the F.B.I. swore under oath that there were no documents pertaining to Cointelpro activities against the Black Panther Party in New York, actual FBI files were introduced into evidence which demonstrated a conspiracy on the part of the Federal, State and City governments to "neutralize and destroy" the Black Panther Party and to eliminate Dhoruba Moore as a leader.

This evidence forced the F.B.I. to concede that these files exist and the Court ordered that they be turned over to Dhoruba and his attorneys. We know, however, that this "surrender" does not mean that the F.B.I. will reveal the extent of its crimes against the Black movement. The attack on 92 Morningside Ave. shows that the tactics have not changed.

Only mass support for the full exposure of Cointelpro and the release of all Black Political Prisoners will bring success.
