

## Demonstrations - first of the season

Black militants on the Florida A&M University campus are still waiting for answers to demands by the Malcolm X United Liberation Front, which was presented last week.

The group presented Dr. Benjamin Perry a list of demands on the steps of Lee Hall which asked for sweeping reforms of administration policies.

After presenting the demands, the Liberation Front said that unity among the black people of Tallahassee and the nation was essential for any blacks to make progress.

"A prime example of the diversion," spokesman Ken Elmsaid said, "is the gap that

exists between FAMU and the Fenchtown area of the black community. Students and faculty of the university do not identify with blacks in Fenchtown.

"They feel they are better than the brothers and sisters in Tallahassee's ghetto."

Members of the group speaking on the FAMU campus said that it is the aim of the Malcolm X Liberation Front to bridge the gap between the university and the black community.

The Malcolm X rally last week on campus made news on Associated Press wires when several blacks removed film from Tallahassee Democrat photographer Sage Thigpen's camera.
