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Fourteen years ago, an incident is recalled of looking at works of art: and wondering how they were made and what their materials were. At that time curiosity and excitement stood between my desire for knowledge: but the following years were both rewarding and fruitful along these lines. I began reading and exploring: trying to understand the basic principles of the asthetic and the quality of craftsmanship that was inherently discernible in the creations of the art works of the "Masters."

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artist instinctively emphasize the content of thought nearest his way of life; therefore individual (personal) experience is the primary factor that opens the way for the infinite variations that have been dealt with and played upon which establishes his mode of expression and is there by depicted in his world of imagery. Throughout my life I have been consciously aware of my environment. The big cities are quickly swallowing up the small towns, but implanted within my mind and the minds of all young black artist of today are visions of past experiences and situations from which I acquire my inspiration to express myself through my work in art.

Through my work at Texas Southern University I have found that young artist should never forget their heritage, for when they do they have abandon their sole purpose in art. My family never had all the luxuries to bestow upon me and I never longed for them, and this in itself is the heritage of the poor. I can always relate a situation of today with one of the past; this comes from being aware of one's environment where one presently finds himself: thus bringing about an awareness that is rare, so rare that only a god given few possess it. In my art work whether it be natural forms in nature or humanistic

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imagery the spectator can both comprehend and associate with some visual relationship which he has encountered through his experiences, with simular subject matter. In thinking back upon my religious heritage, the music and lyrics are the most significant to me in relation to art; all the spirituals each in its own majestic manner says something that the Negro can identify with, because he possesses the heritage of generations and generations of folklore.

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
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encompassed situations from all walks of life: from life to death from happiness to sorrow all in relationship to my past experiences. In one of my paintings entitled, "The Lost Man", I feel I have captured and recreated on canvas the true feelings of a person left without hope. The picture shows a man standing in the snow with only his night robe and work shoes on, behind him is what is left of his home after it has been completely annihilated by fires and to expand the situation even further there are no neighbors or friends he can turn to he is completely alone, and no matter which way he looks he can see nothing but snow until he lifts his eyes up and gaze into the heavens. I used the snow to symbolize the soft, gentle need of peace and happiness, the stars say within themselves that the quietest moments of one's life is when he can stand and gaze upon them in solitude: The fire was used to show how quickly happiness can turn to loneliness and sorrow. This is what I mean when I refer to encompassing situations from all walks of life. I think these are the things that we as artist must become aware of, to be complete in our endeavor and successful in our goals. I think that during the years of my creative involvement: this understanding or awareness (through somewhat slowly) greatly expanded itself spiritually: and to a

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
satisfactory degree, objectively gave meaning and depth to the basic principles and values related to the execution of technical craftsmanship, and unified organization: Thus encouraging my efforts to work and to become more seriously and creatively involved in the human expression of man. I have even become accustom to seeing beauty where the average man sees nothing. In sculpture I have been discipline to take any theme and relate it to one of my past experiences and produce it out of clay. This along with the dexterity of applying myself has, I think, given me enough knowledge to know the qualities that an artist should possess, and with these qualities an artist can produce an infinite amount of creative works just by reexploring his heritage. And most of all the artist must be able to apply this discipline to his everyday life situations.















