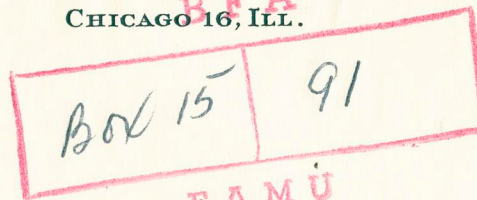

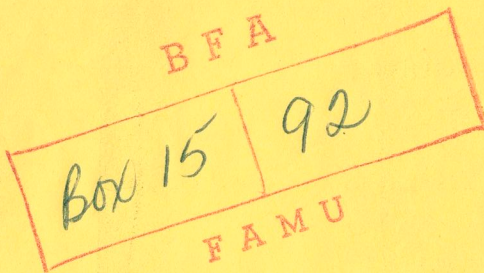

Dear Dr. Gore,

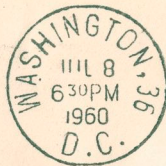
I am looking forward to seeing you at the dinner to be given at the Embassy here in Washington on the 16th of July.

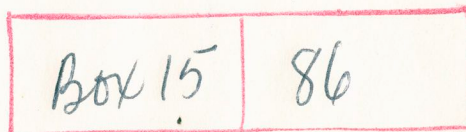

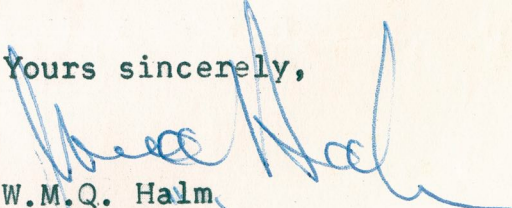
I take great pleasure in acknowledging with thanks your letter of July 25, 1960, asking me to be the guest of your institution November 10-12.

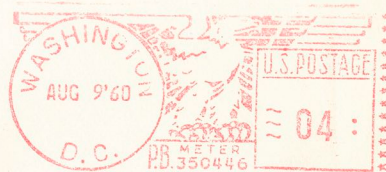

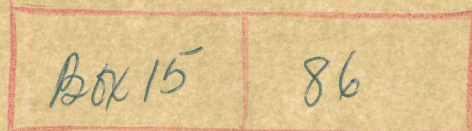

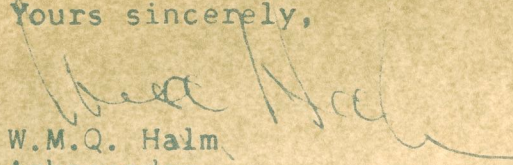
I take great pleasure in acknowledging with thanks your letter of July 25, 1960, asking me to be the guest of your institution November 10-12.
