Pointing to some (e) of the highlights of this case, Mr. Jackson stated that Dr. Bolton and other staff have been very cooperative, but that they intend to do everything in their power to see that matters are changed, as it pertains to segration.

Mr. Jackson indicated that he would furnish the Board with anplicated copies of his statement and recommendations.
