Dear Dr. Gore:

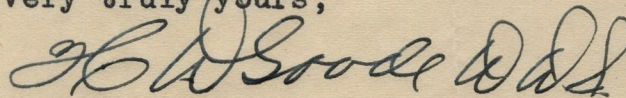
This comes to introduce to you Wendell Austin, a recent graduate of Washington High School, of this city, and to recall to you my conversation with you concerning a scholarship for him.

I was Salutatorian of my class with a 2.470 average, Captain of the Schoolboy Patrol for three years, a member of the Dramatics Department for four years, a member of the public speaking class for one year, a former member of the chrous, and Co-ordinator of the Senior High School on Student Government Day.

I am determined to further my education but due to financial conditions I will be unable to do so without aid. My Father has been sick for the past eight years and unable to work. 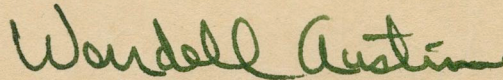
