Long daughter of the said Gen^e Call and now possessed by her or her Trustees for her, also to Value the property belonging to the said Gen^e Call and of which he died possessed: and to set apart therefrom a portion for Mrs J. W. Bivard (born Mary Laura Call) daughter of said Gen^e Call equal in Value to the Land and Slaves conveyed by Deed to Mrs Ellen C. Long by the said Gen^e Richard K Call: And now possessed by her or her Trustees for her, and then to divide the remainder of the property of the said Gen^e Call equally between the said Mrs Ellen C. Long and the said Mrs J. W. Bivard, to be held, together with all other interests devised and bequeathed in and by said Will Subject to the trusts thereof.
