Historical Sketch

1887 ESTABLISHMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISION AND LEGISLATIVE ENACTMENT.

Laws of Florida 1887-Chapter 3692 No. 12, page 36

An act providing for the establishment of State Normal Schools in this State.

SECTION 1. That a Normal School for the training and instruction of white teachers be and is hereby established at DeFuniak Springs, Walton County.

Section 2. That the State Board of Education shall, upon the passage of this bill, or as soon as it becomes a law, proceed to elect a faculty, to consist of a principal and two assistant instructors who shall have in charge, the training and instruction of all students, subject to the approval of the State Board of Education.

SECTION 3. That the sum of \$4,000.00 for the years each of 1887 and 1888 be appropriated to meet the necessary expense of the same.

Laws of Florida 1887-Chapter 3692 No. 12, page 37

Section 4. That a Normal School for the colored teachers be also established at Tallahassee, Leon County, similar in all respects as prescribed above for the establishment of the Normal School for the white teachers and subject to the supervision and direction of the State Board of Education, and the same amount be appropriated to meet the current expenses of the said Normal School for colored teachers.

1887 Appointment of T. D. Tucker as Principal.

Appointment of T. V. Gibbs as Assistant Principal.

Institution opened on October 5th.

Original enrollment was fifteen [15] students.

1891 Institution moved from original location on College Hill to present location, then called Highwood.

1892 FIRST COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES THE FIRST WEDNESDAY IN JUNE.

Exercises held in Munro Opera House. Original graduating class was five
[5] students.

1901 APPOINTMENT OF N. B. YOUNG AS PRESIDENT.

WIST POSITION AS A A A

1905 Management of school transferred from State Board of Education to State Board of Control indicating that henceforth it was to be considered as one of the institutions of higher learning.

1909 Action of 1905 formalized by Act of the State Legislature changing the name of the institution.

Laws of Florida 1909-Chapter 5925 No. 56, page 69

An act changing the name of the Colored Normal School.

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida.

SECTION 1. That the Colored Normal School as at present defined by law be and is hereby changed to and shall be known as the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical College for Negroes.

Section 2. This Act shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor. Approved May 22, 1909.

- 1931 Accredited as a Class "A" college by the Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools of the Southern States.
- 1931 Admitted to membership in the Association of American Colleges and Universities and the American Council on Education.
- 1944 Interim appointment of J. B. Bragg (April 14 September 1) as Acting President.
- 1944 APPOINTMENT OF W. H. GRAY, JR. AS PRESIDENT.
- 1949 Interim appointment of H. Manning Efferson (July 7, 1949 April 1, 1950) as Acting President.
- 1950 Appointment of George W. Gore, Jr. as President.
