Dear Mr. Lee:

I have just received the report of a recent meeting of the Student Council in which statements were made to the effect that line cutting in the dining hall was due primarily to the fact that food gives out before the last persons reach the serving tables. It seems as though the first persons who enter the dining hall secure 2, 3, and 4 orders of major meats, causing a shortage for those who come after.

It has also come to my attention that persons at the end of the line may be served bologna sausage, whereas those at the beginning are receiving chicken.

I think the matter needs to be gone into rather thoroughly, and I desire to make the following suggestions:

- 1. That no more than two orders of meat be served any one person until the entire line has passed.
- 2. That in the emergencies when it is necessary to substitute a meat it would be well to substitute a major hot meat, as for example, pork chops or ham rather than a cold meat.

There is need for guidance in educating the students to select a balanced diet so that they will have the proper relationship of vegetables and meats. In this connection, there is also a need to encourage students to eat three regular rather than one or two meals per day.

The cooperation of the Home Economics Department might be valuable in this connection.

College Tallahassee, Florida Dear Dr. Gore: I wish to call to your attention some anticipated deficits that will affect our budget for the current fiscal year, as well as the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1952. You will note from the budget our anticipated collections, as set up in our Incidental Fund, are \$284,380.00. To date, we have collected \$149,617.45 leaving uncollected \$134,762.55. Of this uncollected amount, we can safely count on collecting \$109,709.00 leaving a deficit of \$25,053.55. This decrease in income is due to a decrease in veteran enrollment. Our estimated enrollment for veterans was 325, whereas our actual enrollment is 238, which, of course, would bring about a decrease in our anticipated income. This deficit will affect our operations for the current year. In view of the decrease in enrollment for the current year, we are estimating our enrollment for the next fiscal year, as far as veterans are concerned, at 175. This will bring about an overall decrease in income of approximately \$54,000.00 as set up in our present budget.
