



ever to built in the state will soon be constructed near Ocala, Florida,

according to a recent announcement by the State Cabinet.

The \$1,368,125.00 contract which was awarded to the Johnson Contracting Company of Atlanta, will entail the construction along with seven dormitory-homes, of a central administration building with a hospital, receiving center, kitchen and dining room facilities, a power plant, water system and vocational building as the initial development in Florida's first home for delinquent Negro girls.

This project has developed following the recommendations of a committee of prominent Negroes appointed in 1946 by Govenor Millard F. Caldwell and headed by Dr. William H. Gray, Jr., President of Florida A. and M. College. The committee reviewed the problems of delinquency in the state and Eartha M. M. White, head of the Clara White Mission of Jacksonville, and Negro social organizations assumed the leading role in following through the recommendations and urging that the home be built.

At a recent meeting of the Inter-racial Committee of the Florida

State Conference of Social Work, upon the motion of Dr. Gray, it was
recommended that one of the buildings of the proposed correctional school
be named the Eartha M. M. White home. It is reported that the Govenor
and State Cabinet have accepted this recommendation.
