Henderson, who was a tall, black and eavy-set negro, went to the home of Conay Younger and assaulted and murdered rs. Valley Dale Younger in the presence her two infant children, cutting hen broat and jabbing the knife into the back of her neck officers are sted him in Const. of her neck. Officers arrested him in Corsiana the next afternoon and at once spirited im away. Bloodhounds trailed Henderson of arrest. Henderson was taken to Hillsboro. Last night the officers in charge of the negro started to take him to Fort Worth for safety. When the train reached Itasca the officers were overpowered and the negro taken from them by citizens of the county, who had gone there for that purpose. Henderson was then brought here. Crowds by Rail to the Lynching.

The first train this morning on the Cottor Belt from Hillsboro was so crowded that it could carry no more. Runners were sen-over the county announcing the arrival of Henderson here, and all the morning people swarmed into the city to take part in or witness the execution of the penalty to be inflicted on the negro. After his confession it was decided to burn him at the stake.
