We the Student-Faculty Sub-Committee on Editing and Refining Recommendations submit the following proposals:

- 1. That a list of persons on the Faculty-Staff-Student University Improvement Committee be printed, and that this list be made available so that students may submit their proposals to the committee.
- 2. That department heads should meet at least with majors once a month.
- 3. That the Women's Department and the Women's Congress should revise the pamphlet "Guide for FAMU Women" so that standards more in keeping with the current increased freedom extended to women college students may be adopted.
- 4. That all organizations that apply for a charter and that go through the specified channels for operation as a campus organization be granted the privilege of operating whether persons in authority personally agree with the philosophy of the organization or not.
- That all department heads be reevaluated in terms of their qualifications and adjustments be made where deemed necessary, and that seniority not be a prerequisite for the positions.
 - 6. That the recruiting of students be a process whereby FAMU students from the various departments involved become members of the recruiting team and the recruitment not be left in the hands of any one person.
 - 7. That the university redefine its role and scope with increased emphasis upon Afro-American studies. Especially should the university seek to train social welfare students, teachers and others who are properly oriented to the problems of black communities in Florida and elsewhere.
 - 8. That an entirely new discipline committee be formed of both faculty and student members.
- 9. That the capital outlay budget relegated to instruction be investigated immediately before the Board of Regents allocates the university budgets.
 - 10. Students on grant-in-aid should not be threatned or intimidated when they express their grievances.

- 11. Communication between students, faculty, staff and administration should be greatly improved through the more frequent publication of the FAMUAN, increased use of bulletin boards and greater availability on the part of all segments of the university.
- 12. Objective criteria for student employment, scholarships, loans and all other forms of financial aid should be drawn up, published and implemented immediately. It is recommended that this function be divorced from the Dean of Students.
- 13. That students, faculty and staff reassert pride in their university and boost rather than down grade the institution.
- 14. That teachers provide more meaningful motivation and utilize more effective and diversified methods of instruction.
- 15. That explorations be made to determine under what conditions telephone service may be installed, resumed, and properly maintained in all dormitories.
- 16. That women student counselors receive the same compensation as do men student counselors.
- 17. That instructors make every effort to aid freshman students in adjusting to and functioning successfully in the university environments.
- 18. That the clinic insure students individual privacy and courtesy in any and all consultations.
- 19. Administration, faculty, staff and students extend mutual courtesies and respect to one another in all of their dealings.

 Alleged discourtesy will be investigated and proper action taken.
- 20. That the SGA exhaust all resources within their allocated budget to obtain voting machines as required.
- 21. That the Office of Admissions and Records create a more efficient method of change of program procedures including the possible use of azograph masters.
- 22. That the existing student-faculty committee on faculty evaluation accelerate its efforts and produce recommendations at the next regular meeting of the Faculty Senate Committee.

- 23. That the Office of Financial Aid immediately consider granting short terms loans to students on their own recognizance without a co-signer.
- 24. That the crucial offices be kept open during the hours of twelve noon and one o'clock: post office, bookstore and office of Admissions and Records; and that the Cashier, Payroll and Business Manager's offices be kept open during these hours the first ten days of every month.

- 12. Objective criteria for student employment, scholarships, loans and all other forms of financial aid should be drawn up, published and implemented immediately. It is recommended that these services should be coordinated by the Office of Financial Aid will be directly accountable to the Office of the President. (An attached format by which it is suggested that this recommendation be implemented, was drawn up by Mr. Peter Wilson, Mathematics Department.
- 14. That all student organizations applying for recognition on campus should present their credentials to a duly constituted committee of faculty and students which shall approve or disapprove their request.
- 8. That an entirely new disciplinary committee be composed of both faculty and student members. Student members be elected by students and faculty members by the usual process. The Dean of Students to be an ex-officio (non-voting) members.

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
