ADOPTION OF TOPEKA PLAN

Dr. Bolton discussed the revisions recommended for inclusion in the 1965-66 Topeka Plan as presented to the members of the Board of Education June 7th

Mr. Rausch moved to adopt the revisions of the Topeka Plan as recommended.

FIVE YEAR STUDY OF BUILDING & SITE NEEDS

Dr. Bolton presented a brochure (on file in the Business Office) on a Five Year Study pertaining to Building and Site Needs. The top priority items recommended were:

Topeka High School - employ an architect to prepare a master plan for remodeling - 1965

Rice Elementary School - build a 4-classroom addition, office and work needed by September 1966

Highland Park Junior High School - site expansion

New Junior High School - needs to be acquired in vicinity of 33rd and Fairlawn to relieve Capper and Jardine

McCarter Elementary School - build a 4-classroom addition. Needed by September 1967

Topeka West High School - Add the mechanical drawing room as discussed in the architect's original design

New Senior High School Site - location and purchase of a new high school site

HIGHLAND PARK JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL SITE

Mr. Kerr reported on a recent telephone call from a realtor relative to the possible purchase by the Board of Education of property adjacent to Highland Park Junior High School. While no funds are presently available for such a purchase, he stated funds would be available after July 1st.

It was agreed that Mr. Kirk, Realtor for the Board, should be contacted relative to negotiating for this property.

EXPERIMENTAL REMOTE TEACHING PROJECT

Dr. Blackburn presented the plans and costs of experimental Teleteaching project which would permit greater use of selected instructors in conducting lectures from surrounding universities; to provide access for pupils to visiting speakers whose time permits visitation to only one school; provide
