TO ALL OPPRESSED THIRD WORLD PEOPLE
OF THIS PRESENT DAY BABYLON, AMERIKKKA.
GREETINGS:

In the midst of this revolutionary struggle here in this modern slave society amerikkka, A political-military army was formed bearing the name, The Black Liberation Army.

The B.L.A. was and is composed of small urban guerrilla units waging war against the oppressive forces in amerikkka, the united states government. We are brothers and sisters who have come together to accomplish A common goal, The Freedom of All oppressed Third World People, in babylon. We are brothers and sisters who have all at one time or another experienced and felt the exploitation and injustice of the oppressive forces here in amerikkka. Therefore we are left no other alternative but to take up arms and deal with these repressive conditions, since the process for equality through the courts have been bigoted.

Being that we are A political military army, The B.L.A. is about Revolutionary action, We are about Revolutionary planning of operations and the method of carrying out the strategy behind the operations. We are about setting Revolutionary examples to prove to the oppressed people in amerikkka that it is necessary to take up arms against these repressive forces of amerikkka, in order to gain our FREEDOM.

The B.L.A. was also organized to deal with the problems that confront the communities of poor oppressed people, such as, Slumlords with their bad housing, Dopr pushers who sell white death (heroin) to any and everybody, including our children. Pimps who exploit the sister body for some money, and prostitutes who exploit their own body for some money, and all the rest of the evils that our people have had to resort to because of our enemy, (the u.s. gov't). We know because we were brought up in these communities.

We realize that this is going to be A long and drawn out struggle for our Freedom. and we hope you realize that it is necessary for all

Revolutionary brothers and sisters to survive out here in babylon. The above ground apparatus of the Black Liberation Army can survive by getting jobs or any other so-called legal means, but the underground apparatus of the Black Liberation Army does not have the same alternatives and has to resort to expropriations of such things as money, arms and ammunition etc. Therefore many mistakes will be made In the process of expropriating, since there is little or no help from the outside, meaning the masses of the people.

Approximately four and one half (4½) months ago, several brothers allegedly committed an act to expropriate funds through armed action, In new Haven, Connecticut. Unfortunatley this act was never completed, the end result was, two (2) pigs wounded, and three (3) brothers captured and accused of this enactment. The three brothers captured were Michael Alston, James Haskin, and Harold Simmon. Since that time the brothers have recieved no communication, no support, and no help from the masses of the people.

For too long we have been silent and let these oppressive forces lead our brothers and sisters into these kangaroo court rooms, filled with hypocrisy, puppets for judges, and A jury with their minds already made up (because the defendants are third world people), and silently, we watch them act out the parts of so-called justice.

For too long our brothers and sisters have been railroaded off to concentration camps and isolated from this so-called free society, because they have also had no communications, no support, and no help from the masses of the people. Experience has shown that brothers and sisters who have had little or no communication with family, friends or public, have been found guilty without opposition. They have been locked away and forgotten about because no one puts up A fight on behalf of their welfare as human beings.

"YOU the masses have boundless creative powers," with your support, with your fullest support, A brother or sisters would not have to go through the changes of entering these hypocritical court rooms because you would assist them in maintaining their freedom on the streets.
