Dear President Gore:

With 1954 on us, naturally my thoughts turn to the Workshop program for this summer. I want you to know how much we appreciate the efforts that you and the members of your staff are making to provide a valuable service to many teachers in Florida. We have received a number of letters here in this office from your participants requesting materials from us, which obviously shows that they are trying to implement the experiences that they had in the Workshop in their own classroom work. If we were seeking for some measure of evaluation of your efforts, certainly this would be evidence for it. I know that your enthusiasm and the enthusiasm of Mr. Parks, Mr. Kidd and Mr. Austin has done much to stimulate this interest.

The Business Education Division of the Committee for Economic Development is most interested in the work that you are doing. They believe, as we do, that every effort should be made to continue the operation of these Workshops at Florida A & M College, Fisk University and Texas Southern University. It was this feeling, coupled with our own, that brought about the decision to make available to each of these schools some funds out of our own budget to carry on these Workshops. There is every indication that the same decision will be made this year.

We are also carrying on our investigations with various other groups interested in Negro education to see if it is possible to secure additional finances for the operation of these Workshops and I hope to have some information for you on this some time this spring.

I am sure that you have found that business men, labor and agricultural leaders and educators all over the State of Florida have a high degree of interest in this program, and I am sure that you can call on them for their personal support when it fits in with your planning.

No doubt your staff has been developing its plans for the 1954 Workshop and I would appreciate any information that might be available at this time regarding these plans.

We expect to be holding our usual spring conference for Workshop directors and we will let you know about this as soon as the date has been set.
