

RALPH N. DAVIS SUCCEEDS MONROE N. WORK

TUSKEGEE INSTITUTE—(ANP) — Ralph N. Davis has succeeded Monroe N. Work as director of the Department of Records and Research at Tuskegee Institute. Mr. Work, famous as a sociologist and editor of the Negro year book, voluntarily requested retirement having reached the required number of years in service as well as age. It is understood that Mr. Work will utilize his freedom from routine responsibility to engage more fully into research here.

Mr. Davis has been for many years assistant to Dr. Work. He returned to Tuskegee this fall after spending 18 months in graduate study at the University of Chicago where he is completing work for his doctorate. His thesis is based upon study of the Negro newspaper.
