

In confirmation of my telephone conversation with you yesterday, I wish to advise that Mr. Hollis Dann of the U.S.L.T.A. has discussed with me the following:

> They have extended an invitation to Althea Gibson to participate in the National Indoor Championships which will be held at the 7th Regiment Armory in New York City February 16 - 24th inclusive. The Committee has agreed to give \$50.00 towards her expenses from Tallahassee to New York.

At the conclusion of this Tournament, Mr. Dann states that he will take her to Jamaica, B.W.I. to participate in an invitational tournament at the St. Andrews Club in Kingston, Jamaica and, also, in the Caribbean Championships at Montego Bay. They will leave New York by plane on Thursday, February 28th and expect to return to Miami. Florida on Monday, March 10th. They will drop Althea at Miami and send her on to Tallahassee. All expenses for this tour will be paid by the Committee in charge.

Her expenses incidental to the Indoor Tournament including her fare from Tallahassee to New York, we know will run above \$50.00 and we would appreciate it if the School would make up whatever difference there may be.

I am submitting to you the material you requested concerning Althea Gibson.

Althea Gibson, Eastern Indoor Champion and National Negro Women's Singles Champion and a sophomore at Florida A and M College College played in eight major tennis tournaments this year.

In February, she won the women's singles title of the Eastern Indoor meet at New York, defeating M. Hirsh Lang of Forest Hills, New York,

In March, she reached the finals of the National Indoor Singles Championship, losing to Nancy Chaffee of Ventura, California.


She participated in the Clay Court Championship at River Forest, Illinois. She defeated the Champion of Mexico, Mela Ramirez and Betty Gray of Houston, Texas. She was defeated by Doris Hart, the number one seeded player, who won the title.

In preparation for the grass courts in Forest Hills, she played in two meets in New York and New Jersey.

She won the championship in the Midwestern Tennis Meet, at Columbus, Ohio, August 19 - 20.

Althea won the National Negro Women's Singles championship held at Wilberforce for the third consecutive year. She and Dr. W. R. Johnson also won mixed doubles crown.

She was the first Negro to play in the National Grass Court Tennis Championship at Forest Hills, New York, defeating Barbara Knapp of England 6-2, 6-2 and was leading Louise Brough, the Wimbledon Champion, in the

Dear Hollis: Miss Gibson Our head office in London is very interested to hear of the possibility of Miss Gibson visiting Europe this summer and would like to be of all possible assistance to Miss Gibson. As soon as I can inform London of definite confirmation that Miss Gibson is going to England, Slanzengers Limited will set everything in motion to insure that her visit is a tremendous success. I am enclosing with this letter a list of English tournaments. Lohdon very strongly advises Miss Gibson to concentrate upon English grass court tournaments so that she can tune herself up for Wimbledon. The best one to aim at as a start is Surbiton which begins on May 28th, and she would be wise to follow this by Northern Manchester, Beckenham, Queens and then Wimbledon. Once Miss Gibson reaches England all sorts of people will be after her in an endeavor to attract her to their tournament and especially some of the Continental Associations, but our considered opinion very definitely is that her main target should be Wimbledon. It is at Wimbledon that she will get most publicity and it is there that she will want to do best. In order to achieve this, Miss Gibson should in our opinion go to the tournaments named above, get experience on English grass courts and incidentally there will be a strong entry of both English and Continental players at these tournaments which will give her plenty of good match practice. After the Wimbledon Championships, Miss Gibson could play in two more tournaments and these should be Felixstowe from July 9th to 14th and Frinton, both of which are delightful tournaments in every way. Incidentally on the enclosed list of tournaments, the red marks indicate those tournaments which have officially adopted the Slazenger tennis ball. You will note that this is by far the majority. Finally, would you very kindly ask Miss Gibson to let us have the exact specification of her tennis racquet, so that Slazengers can arrange to make up identical supplies for her use in England.
