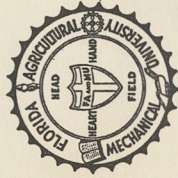
Board of Control Action, Friday, Sept. 14, 1962

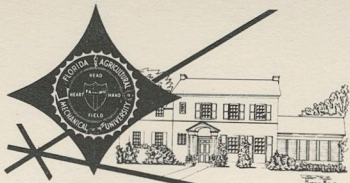

The State of the University

It is announced a district printer to discuss with the entire faculty and staff of the University the problems, plans and outlook of the new scholastic year 1962-63. This is truly a significant year - the seventy-fifth year of FAMU and a part of our Diamond Anniversary. By action of the Florida State Legislature and the Board of Control we are beginning year-round operations on a tri-~~partite~~ basis.

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As a part of the Grand Anniversary we shall continue the program of monthly celebrations with the accent on African background in October, October in October, and great college education in November. The Orange Blossom classic and the future of FAMU in December. Special faculty centers have been appointed to implement the program. At the present time plans are underway to publish the official history of FAMU primarily through the University of Florida Press.

Special events for the fall semester include ~~for~~ four outstanding graduation centers in Broward Stadium: Beachside College, October 29; Lincoln University of Miami, October 6, Junior A and B; State University, October 27, Homecoming with the classic A.B.T., November 3. The Gateway Classic will be played against Miami State University, with the Gateway Bowl, Jacksonville, November 24 and the Orange Blossom Classic will be held in the Orange Bowl on December 8. The Shrine Bowl and Shrine Classic will be held on the same dates 25-26. A variety series of lectures and plays featuring has been outlined by the University of the Virgin and Monthly Connection will bring to the campus several outstanding speakers and performers.

In view of the rapid rate of construction this year I have asked deans and department heads to work more closely with the building staff with respect to some outstanding library, amputee, gymnasium and find locations where the time will pass before the course have truly been completed. Shortly, too, will have to be planned to cover more materials in a shorter time and with ~~the~~ better retention.

The educational complexion of Florida is rapidly changing. Standards are being raised. There is the ninth grade and twelfth grade tests for all states with a single standard. The Graduate Record Examinations is being used for admission to the colleges. In June of 1963, the Board of Control is instituting a Florida College Grant Program for admission to senior colleges or to the other divisions of state universities. At first the tests will be differentiated. In 1964 the results will be used for admission to ~~the~~ the other divisions in all ~~the~~ Florida state universities and will be the basis for all internal and external transfers to the other divisions of a state university. Public School teachers must now receive a salary of \$500 or else to be certified in Florida and must make some of \$600 or ~~more~~ above to receive state salaries. The transfer system which is being in the state universities in 1963 will be expanded to ~~include~~ ^{include} junior colleges by 1965 and may at a later date ^{include} the entire public school system of Florida.

Of Florida A+M. University is to raise its merit measure up to the highest academic standards. We must measure ourselves as one performer.
