TWYMON MYERS--He Was Not a Terrorist

He's a Freedom Fighter!

On November 14th, 1973 a member of and property of the Black community was ambushed and killed by numerous N.Y.C. police and F.B.I. agents.

The Brother was shot in the back and not given a chance to even defend himself. He was shot repeatedly. His right leg was shot off along with malicious abuse to all other parts of his body.

Why was this brother killed?

Because he stood for justice and freedom of Black people and all oppressed brothers and sisters. He was killed because he stood up against the system and power structure. His begin contrary to the pigs, and a threat to their continued existence they found it necessary to get rid of him.

The police department would have us believe that Twymon had no support from the people, that he was simply a bandit and a criminal.
