ANSWER OF UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 501
TO PLAINTIFF-INTERVENORS' INTERROGATORY NOS. 7, 8 and 9
OF THE SECOND SET

7. Provide all information identifying students by race and by school of attendance from each optional attendance zone described in answer to the First Set of Interrogatories.

8. From 1950 to the present, from all Junior High Schools please identify entering students for each year by race and by elementary school of origin.

9. From 1950 to the present, for all High Schools please identify entering students for each year by race and by Junior High school of origin.

ANSWER:

Introduction

A systematic search of available School District records to determine the extent to which answers could be provided for Interrogatory Nos. 7, 8 and 9 of Intervening Plaintiffs' Interrogatories-Second Set has been completed. The chart set forth hereafter at page 7 provides a visual display of each type of data by school year that is available to assist in compiling the information requested. An answer of "yes" or "no" on a selected line or column indicates the potential availability of that type of information from the current active or inactive records of the School District.

The alphabetic September 15th rosters of students listed by grade and by school which have the race code and address of the student's parent or lawful custodian's legal residence are available for school years 1974-75 through 1981-82. These rosters would permit seven years of comparison and identification. For the period of 1970 to 1973, the School District does possess alphabetic rosters of students by grade and by school for the September 15th enrollment, but these records do not show a "race" code.

For the period of years from 1950 to 1969, the School District does not have any rosters of students by grade, school or district. It should be noted that for the period of 1950-51 to 1958-59 all students in grades 10-12 had to attend Topeka High School if they continued a public school enrollment within Topeka School District No. 23, the predecessor of Unified School District No. 501.

Highland Park High School was annexed into the Topeka district effectively enrolling students in grades 10-12 for the 1959-60 school year. The construction of Topeka West High School was sufficiently completed to enable the enrollment of students in grades 10-12 for the 1961-62 school year.

A scholarship and attendance card is prepared annually by the school attended, whether the student was enrolled for one day or the entire school year. The "race" code appears to have been recorded on these cards for only the period of 1950-51 through 1960-61. The cards for students enrolled from the 1961-62 school through the current 1981-82 school year do not list the "race" of the student. If a student had completed the 9th grade prior to or during the 1977-78 school year, the scholarship cards representing the combined school experience of that student would be recorded on microfilm. These scholarship cards for grades K-9 were grouped alphabetically prior to microfilming. The groupings by years are shown as follows:

Group II	1950-51 through 1955-56
Group III	1956-57 through 1965-66
Group IV	1966-67 through 1969-70
Group V	1970-71 through 1977-78

The cards for other students who have completed the 8th or 9th grades since the 1977-78 school year current exist (but have not been microfilmed) and are located in the administrative offices of Unified School District No. 501.

Response to Interrogatory No. 7

It should be noted that beginning with the 1977-78 school year no optional attendance areas existed for the senior high schools of Unified School District No. 501. Beginning with the 1975-76 school year there were no optional attendance areas for the elementary and junior high schools of the School District.

The first school year for which maps exist identifying all optional attendance areas at the elementary, junior high and senior high levels is the 1963-64 school year. As a result, contained hereafter in Attachment I is the School District's study identifying the common optional attendance zones by school year for all three levels beginning in 1963 through 1974. In addition, the number of students in the optional attendance area by race and the school attended is also contained in Attachment I for the following years: 1974-75 school year for both elementary and junior high optional attendance zones; and 1974-75 through 1976-1977 school years for senior high optional attendance zones. From this study it has been determined that further answers to Interrogatory No. 7 may be derived from an examination and inspection of business records maintained by the School District, all of which records are specified on the chart set forth hereafter at page 7.

Alphabetic rosters containing the name and race of each student exist only for school years 1974-75 through 1981-82. Therefore, the race of students within optional attendance areas prior to the 1974-75 school year would have to be obtained from scholarship cards, registration cards or student cumulative

folders. Based upon the time expended to complete the years identified in Attachment I, it appears that for each school year in question, at least 60 person hours would be required to tabulate the information. To require Unified School District No. 501 to complete this answer clearly would be burdensome and expensive. The burden of deriving or ascertaining the answers will be substantially the same for the intervening plaintiffs as for personnel of Unified School District No. 501. Therefore, pursuant to Rule 33(c), Fed. Rules of Civil P., the records from which further answer to Interrogatory No. 7 may be derived shall be made available to the intervening plaintiffs for their examination and inspection at the administrative offices of Unified School District No. 501 located at 624 West 24th Street, Topeka, Kansas.

Response to Interrogatory Nos. 8 and 9

The material presented in Attachment II summarizes the results of the study conducted by the School District for the 1981-82 school year for the purpose of determining the extent to which answers could be provided for Interrogatory Nos. 8 and 9. Attachment II identifies the numbers of students currently enrolled in 7th or 9th grade by race who were formerly enrolled during the 1980-81 school year in the 6th or 8th grade in the School District. A total of 102 person hours were expended to complete this one year analysis and reporting. To answer Interrogatory Nos. 8 and 9 for prior years would require at least as much time per school year as that expended so far. To require Unified School District No. 501 to answer the remainder of Interrogatory Nos. 8 and 9 would be unduly burdensome and expensive.

The chart set forth hereafter on page 7 was prepared to demonstrate whether the specific types of student data exist for the accurate documentation required to answer Interrogatory Nos. 8 and 9. Answers to Interrogatory Nos. 8 and 9 for prior school years may be derived from an examination and inspection of the

business records maintained by the School District. To the extent that answers can be obtained, the records necessary to do so are specifically identified in the chart set forth at page 7. The burden of deriving or ascertaining the answers will be substantially the same for the intervening plaintiffs as for personnel of Unified School District No. 501. Therefore, pursuant to Rule 33(c), Fed. Rules of Civil P., the records from which the answers to Interrogatory Nos. 8 and 9 may be derived shall be made available to the intervening plaintiffs for their examination and inspection at the administrative offices of Unified School District No. 501 located at 624 West 24th Street, Topeka, Kansas.

To ascertain further answers to Interrogatory Nos. 7, 8 and 9, intervening plaintiffs may need to review business records of the School District which include personally identifiable information in education records of students. Unified School District No. 501 has a policy and practice against releasing or providing access to such records. The School District is willing to permit inspection of such documents by the intervening plaintiffs upon the following agreement: (1) access to the information and data contained within those records shall be permitted only to the extent necessary for intervening plaintiffs to ascertain answers to Interrogatory Nos. 7, 8 and 9; (2) access to education records of students and data contained within the records of Unified School District No. 501 shall be restricted by the intervening plaintiffs solely to those attorneys retained by the intervening plaintiffs, the office personnel employed by said attorneys, and the consultants retained by the intervening plaintiffs to assist in the preparation of this case for trial; and (3) intervening plaintiffs and their "trial counsel"¹ shall be allowed to compile the data or information contained within said

¹The term "trial counsel" refers to the attorneys retained by the intervening plaintiffs, the office personnel employed by said attorneys and the consultants retained by the intervening plaintiffs to assist in the preparation of this case for trial.

education records as set forth herein. Intervening plaintiffs and their trial counsel are prohibited from copying, compiling, assembling, transferring or otherwise using any name, address or other information intending to identify any present or former students of Unified School District No. 501 (or its predecessor) and the parents of said students. Upon written confirmation of intervening plaintiffs' agreement to these terms, access will be provided.

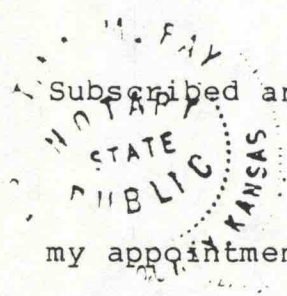
