Dear Coach Gaither:

The Committee of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools was most critical of our institution with respect to our policy of dealing with intercollegiate athletics. They felt that there was not sufficient administrative regulations and control over our program. They requested the following change to take place immediately:

- 1. That an overall policy making committee be established composed of administrative and faculty members. This committee should not be composed of thirty-nine (39) persons primarily concerned with ticket selling, ushers, and ticket taking.
- 2. That athletic scholarships be awarded through a central scholarship committee, the same as used for other types of scholarships.
- 3. That the policy of having athletic scholarships awarded by the athletic department is regarded as highly undesirable.

- 2) The names of the twelve instructors whom you recommend to carry the program.

In nominating the 1961 summer faculty, please be governed by the criteria indicated below:

- 1) There is a need for the services of the instructors.
- 2) A minimum of thirty (30) semester hours beyond the Masters degree should have been earned by the individual.
- 3) It is customary to invite all athletic coaches to serve on the summer faculty.
- 4) All other nominees should have successfully completed a minimum of five (5) semester hours of Advanced Study within the last five year period.

Your attention to this matter is needed and will be appreciated greatly.



Dear Dr. Gaither:

The attached statement of operation for the University Athletic Association Fund covers the period from July 1, 1961 to June 30, 1962. The form follows the same format of the regular monthly reports prepared during the fiscal year.

A resume of the year's fiscal activity shows the following significant factors:

- 1. The overall income exceeded expenditures by \$32,000.69, which resulted in a substantial reduction of the June 30, 1961 deficit of \$179,231.37. Percentage wise, the reduction was approximately 18%.
- 2. Outstanding purchase orders in the amount of \$5,213.56 at June 30, 1962 are being carried forward against the 1962-63 budget. A cooperative detailed audit of these items may eliminate some of them through cancellation and other liquidation as determined by the audit. This will be accomplished during July in cooperation with the Athletic Business Manager.

Additional pro-rata shares for special athletic events in the 1961-62 fiscal year were received in July 1962 as follows:
