



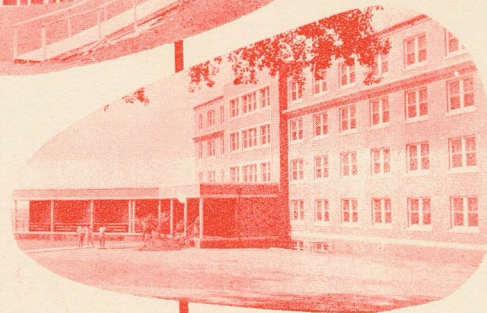
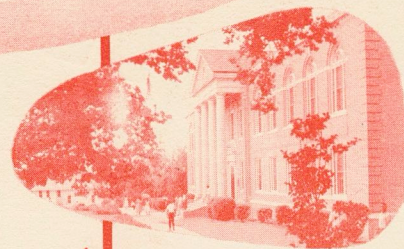
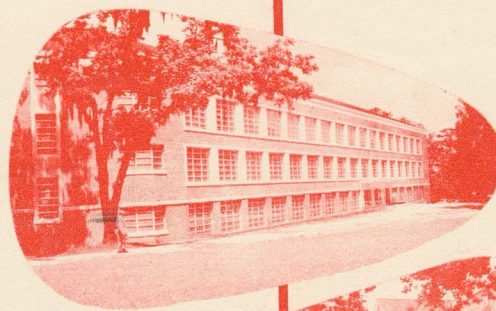

GEORGE WILLIAM GORE, JR.

ONE OF AMERICA'S LEADING EDUCATORS. PRESIDENT, FLORIDA A.M., ONE OF THE LARGEST NEGRO UNIVERSITIES. PIONEER WORK IN THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE NEGRO PRESS. AUTHOR, TWO WORKS ON NEGRO JOURNALISM, THE FIRST PUBLISHED 1922; THE SECOND, WHICH EARNED HIM A PH.D. AT COLUMBIA. AMONG HIS FORMER STUDENTS ARE SEVEN WELL KNOWN WRITERS. M.ED. DEGREE FROM HARVARD UNIV. FORMERLY PROFESSOR AND DEAN, ENGLISH AND JOURNALISM TENN. A&I STATE COLLEGE. CONTRIBUTOR TO LEADING MAGAZINES ON EDUCATION.

ACCORDING TO BIBLICAL TRADITION, NIMROD, SON OF CUSH, GRANDSON OF HAM, "MIGHTY HUNTER BEFORE THE LORD" WAS FOUNDER OF THE GREAT EMPIRES OF ASSYRIA AND BABYLON. CUSH, HIMSELF, WAS ANCESTOR OF THE ETHIOPIANS. IN THE SEPTUAGINT, OLDEST TRANSLATION OF THE OLD TESTAMENT, THE "LAND OF CUSH" IS ETHIOPIA. THERE'S GOOD REASON TO BELIEVE THAT THESE ANCIENT EASTERN PEOPLES WERE VERY DARK. THE WHITES DID NOT REACH THAT AREA TILL MANY CENTURIES LATER.



NEGRO SLAVERY LASTED LONGER IN ENGLAND THAN IN THE UNITED STATES. ENGLAND FROM ABOUT 1440 TO 1834; UNITED STATES FROM 1526 TO 1865, OR ABOUT 50 YEARS LESS. LIVERPOOL AND BRISTOL WERE THE GREAT SLAVE-TRADING PORTS IN ENGLAND. THE ENGLISH COURTS OUTLAWED SLAVERY IN 1702 BUT IT WAS RESTORED. OUTLAWED AGAIN IN 1772, IT CONTINUED UNTIL 1834. BLACKS, VAST NUMBERS OF THEM, WERE BROUGHT IN FOR FOUR CENTURIES, WERE ABSORBED BY THE ENGLISH.

Only In America

Without humanism

Sen. Jesse Helms and Congressman Jim Martin represent the people of North Carolina without a speck of humanism in their votes and speeches on the floors of the Congress and in their entire attitude.

They vote against every measure which is calculated to abolish poverty, to renew the cities, to eliminate pollution and to approach the high ethical goals of Wilson's "New Freedom," Roosevelt's "New Deal," Truman's "Fair Deal," Kennedy's "New Frontier" and Johnson's "Great Society."

In their policies there is totally lacking an open, flexible system. Instead they give us a closed system of dogma, assuming certain priori principles to be applicable to the welfare of the banks, the insurance companies, the real estate operators and big business in general.

They refuse to anticipate the unen-

ding changes by the will of the people. It is not "radicalism" any more than "conservatism" that is a danger, but that ignorant conservatism alike are detrimental to our civilization. The "Liberal" is prepared to be "conservative" when there is good to be conserved and to be radical when fundamental changes are required for the social good.

Jesse Helms and Jim Martin both embrace social and political ignorance and philosophical dogmatism and injustice. They violate every principle of humanitarianism. They are against spending and for balanced budgets.

They forget that under Republican President McKinley the budget was balanced every year and yet millions of people were saving pennies to buy a cake of ice in the summer.

Helms and Martin would begrudge the people their rights to Social Security, TVA, fair housing, and the end to racial segregation. Jesse Helms is to the right of Caligula and Congressman Martin is to the right of Mark Hanna and I do not believe that North Carolina subscribes to these ideas; not the North Carolina of Josephus Daniels, Kerr Scott and Frank Graham and the North Carolina which Adlai Stevenson carried twice against Eisenhower.
