Slogans cleaned from building

NEW BRUNSWICK - Workmen were steam-cleaning spray-painted slogans in support of accused murderer JoAnne Chesimard from the outside walls of the Middlesex County Courthouse this morning and hoped to have finished the job before the start of her 9:30 a.m. court session.

Middlesex County Sheriff Joseph De-Marino said the slogans "Free Assa-ta," "Stop the Lynching" and others were painted on the building and a nearby sidewalk between 1 and 2 a.m.

The sequestered panel is transported on a bus with shielded windows, and is brought to the courtroom by an alternate, undisclosed route, the sheriff said.

to the early-morning arrest It is not known whether the painting is related of five Brooklyn women who were charged with posting handbills on public property.

Police said they had been pasting posters in support of Mrs. Chesimard on the county welfare offices at New Street and Livingston Avenue. One of the women also has been charged with possession of lottery slips for the Free Assata Defense Committee.
