SUBJECT: Adjustment in Class Hours to Cover Time Missed During April

Upon my recommendation, the Faculty Senate approved the recommendation of your committee for the extension of class periods. Beginning Monday, April 29, 1968, the following time schedule will be used for four weeks (this is the same schedule used during the trimester system):

STUDENT-FACULTY COMMITTEE ON UNIVERSITY IMPROVEMENT

Proposals

- 1. That a list of persons on the Faculty-Staff Student University Improvement Committee be printed, and that this list be made available so that students may submit their proposals to the committee.
- 2. That department heads should meet at least once a month with majors. (as a group)
- 3. That the Women's Department and the Women's Congress should revise the pamphlet "Living in Residence Halls" so that standards more in keeping with the current increased freedom extended to women college students may be adopted.
- 4. That all organizations that apply for a charter and that go through the specified channels for operation as a campus organization be granted the privilege of operating whether persons in authority personally agree with the philosophy of the organization or not.
- 5. That the recruiting of students be a process whereby FAMU students from the various departments involved become members of the recruiting team and the recruitment not be left in the hands of any one person.
- 6. That the university redefine its role and scope with increased emphasis upon Afro-American studies. Especially should the university seek to train social welfare students, teachers and others who are properly oriented to the problems of black communities in Florida and elsewhere.
- 7. That an entirely new discipline committee be formed of both faculty and student members elected by students, the Dean of Students to be an ex-officio non voting member.
- 8. No student, especially those on grant-in-aid or paying their own way, should be threatened or intimidated when they express their grievances.
- 9. Communication between students, faculty, staff and administration should be greatly improved through the more frequent publication of the FAMUAN, increased use of bulletin boards and greater availability on the part of all segments of the university.
- 10. Objective criteria for student employment, scholarships, loans, and all other forms of financial aid should be drawn up, published, and implemented immediately. It is recommended that this function be divorced from the Office of the Dean of Students.

- 11. That students, faculty and staff reassert pride in their university and boost rather than downgrade the institution.
- 12. That teachers provide more meaningful motivation and utilize more effective and diversified methods of instruction.
- 13. That explorations be made to determine under what conditions telephone service may be installed, resumed, and properly maintained in all dormitories.
- 14. That an additional number of student employees be assigned to the Women's Department.
- 15. That instructors, administrators, and all other staff members make every effort to aid freshman students in adjusting to and functioning successfully in the university environment.
- 16. That the clinic insure students individual privacy and courtesy in any and all consultations.
- 17. Administration, faculty, staff, and students extend mutual courtesy and respect to one another in all of their dealings. That alleged discourtesy will be investigated and proper action taken.
- 18. That the Office of Admissions and Records create a more efficient method of change of program procedures including the possible use of azograph masters.
- 19. That the existing student-faculty committee on faculty evaluation accelerate its efforts and produce recommendations at the next regular meeting of the Faculty Senate Committee.
- 20. That the Office of Financial Aid immediately consider granting short term loans to students on their own recognizance without a co-signer.
- 21. That the crucial offices be kept open during the hours of twelve noon and one o'clock: Post Office, Bookstore and Office of Admissions and Records; and that the Cashier, Payroll, and Business Manager's office be kept open during these hours the first ten days of every month.
