ANSWER:

No change in the answer originally served on January 29, 1981.

If your school district is a successor, in whole or in part, to a prior school district or school districts, provide the following information for each such immediate predecessor: The name, description or title of each such a. immediate predecessor school district. Describe the geographical boundaries of each such b. immediate predecessor school district. State the manner in which each immediate C. predecessor was created and specify the legal authority for its creation. ANSWER: No change in the answer originally served on April 3, 1981. Describe the geographic boundaries of your school district as presently constituted.

ANSWER:

Attached hereto as Attachment A is the legal description of the geographic boundaries of Unified School District No. 501. The only changes from the answer originally served January 5, 1981, involve the transfer of territories between Unified School District No. 501 and Unified School District No. 437, which transfer was approved by the Kansas State Board of Education on June 13, 1984, effective July 1, 1984. The transfer of territory was proposed and ultimately approved as noted in Attachment 1.

ANSWER:

Since January 29, 1981, the date on which Unified School District No. 501 served its original answer to this interrogatory, on one occasion, pursuant to an agreement for transfer of territory between Unified School District No. 501 and Unified School District No. 437 (Auburn-Washburn), certain territory was exchanged between the districts, modifying the boundaries of the school districts, primarily to conform to the roads existing in these residential areas. Prior to the transfer of territory, confusion existed regarding the precise location of the boundaries as in these particular areas boundaries ran through private property rather than following the roadway. Attached hereto as Attachment B is the order signed by Harold Blackburn, Commissioner of Education for the Kansas State Department of Education, dated June 13, 1984, approving the agreement for transfer of territories between Unified School District No. 501 and Unified School District No. 437. Affixed to the Commissioner's order are descriptions of the territory transferred from Unified School District No. 437 to Unified School District No. 501 (identified as Exhibit A), and the territory transferred from Unified School District No. 501 to Unified School District No. 437 (identified as Exhibit B). By its terms, the order was made effective July 1, 1984. The authorization for the transfer of territory by

agreement of boards of education upon approval by the State Board of Education is conferred by K.S.A. 72-7101 to 72-7108.

ANSWER:

With the exception of the agreement for the transfer of territories between Unified School District No. 501 and Unified School District No. 437 (Auburn-Washburn), which was approved by the Kansas State Board of Education on June 13, 1984, effective July 1, 1984, there have been no changes in the boundaries of Unified School District No. 501 since the serving of its original answer to this interrogatory on January 30, 1981. For more specific information regarding the transfer, see answer to Interrogatory No. 5 above.

- 6. e. State the number of students lost by your school district as a result of each such loss or decrease by:
 - 1. Total students
 - 2. White students
 - 3. Black students
 - 4. Other minority students

ANSWER:

According to school district records, potentially eight current students of Unified School District No. 501 could be "lost" by the district to Unified School District No. 437 as a result of the transfer. All eight students are White. However, at the present time, it is not possible to determine the precise number of students "lost" as a result of this transfer since with respect to those eight students (as well as those which may be residing in the territory transferred to Unified School District No. 501) the boards of education agreed to grant permission and waiver of out-of-district tuition, through minute action, for the successive enrollments of any student in the school(s) of the district currently serving the residence of their parent(s) or legal guardian until: (1) the student graduates from senior high school; or (2) the student fails to maintain satisfactory enrollment status; or (3) the student's parent or legal guardian ceased to maintain their legal residence in the current recorded residence. Only those current students of Unified School District No. 501 who would be affected by this transfer of territory have the option of continuing their enrollment in Unified School District No. 501.

INROLLMENT AND ASSIGNMENT OF STUDENTS

- I. Age Requirements for Entering Head Start, Kindergarten, and Primary First Year Students
 - A. Legal Requirements
 - 1. K.S.A. 72-1107 as amended in 1965, established the minimum school entrance age for primary first year and kindergarten. Portions of this statute applicable to the Topeka Public Schools read 'as follows: "Subsection (a)-Any child who will attain the age of six (6) years on or before the first day of September of any school year shall be able to attend the elementary grades in the school district of his residence except as herein otherwise provided." "Subsection (d)-In districts maintaining free kindergarten, any child who will attain the age of five (5) years on or before the first of September of any school year shall be eligible to enter such kindergarten, except as herein otherwise provided."
 - Kansas law requires that the pupil present an immunization certificate at the initial enrollment.

B. District Requirements

- 1. A birth certificate is required as evidence of age upon entering Head Start, kindergarten, or elementary level.
- Head Start enrollees must be four (4) years old on or before September 1 of the project year.
- 3. Any child who was legally enrolled and attended a kindergarten course maintained by another public school district or state accredited private or parochial school where another state does not provide public school kindergarten, shall be eligible to enter kindergarten regardless of age.
- 4. Any child who has completed a kindergarten course maintained by another public school district or state accredited private or parochial school where another state does not provide public school kindergarten, shall be eligi-

II. Residence Requirements

A. K.S.A. 72-1046—School Residence.

"Any child of school age shall be deemed to have a school residence in the district in which such child lives if such child lives with an adult who is a resident of said district and such adult is (a) the lawful custodian of said child or (b) a person other than such child's parents because of the separation of said parents; or (c) a relative or person who is contributing the major portion of the cost of the support of such child. Lawful custodian means parent, step-parent, foster parent, guardian, or other person having legal custody of child or who is by law liable to maintain, care for or support such child."

B. K.S.A. 77-201-Rules of Construction

The Twenty-third Rule

"The term 'residence' shall be construed to mean the place adopted by a person as such person's place of habitation, and to which, whenever such person is absent, such person has the intention of returning. When a person eats at one place and sleeps at another, the place where such person sleeps shall be deemed such person's residence."

The Twenty-fourth Rule

"The terms 'usual place of residence' and 'usual place of abode,' when applied to the service of any process or notice, shall be construed to mean the place usually occupied by a person. If such person has no family, or does not have his or her family with him or her, such person's office or place of business, or if such person has no place of business, the room or place where such person usually sleeps shall be construed to be such place of residence or abode."

C. Any student who is eighteen years of age or older may establish his/her own legal residence.

III. Student Assignment to Attendance Areas

In order to make the optimum use of District school facilities all schools shall have designated attendance areas established by the Board of Education. All students in regular grades kindergarten through twelve are required to attend the school to which they are assigned by their residence except as provided by Board policy.

IV. Change of Residence Within the District Students whose parent, lawful custodian, or other person determining residency (See Section II, A.) moves into the attendance area of another school during the regular school year may remain enrolled until the end of the school year in the school in which they were enrolled immediately prior to the move.

V. Student Enrollment Transfers

- A. If a parent or lawful custodian or other person determining residency (See Section II, A.) desires to have his/her child attend a school other than the one to which the student has been assigned by the residence of the parent or lawful custodian, a written application for transfer of enrollment must be submitted to the Superintendent of Schools or the Superintendent's designee indicating the reason(s) for the request. Applications for enrollment transfer may not be made for more than one school year. All applications for transfer of enrollment shall be reviewed and either approved or denied by the Superintendent of Schools or the Superintendent's designee.
- B. A period of time for the receipt of applications for transfer of enrollment for the succeeding school year shall be designated annually by the Superintendent of Schools. Applications for transfer of enrollment at times after the designated period are discouraged.
- C. Applications for transfer of enrollment will only be approved for (a) a majority student who requests transfer of enrollment to a school which has a higher minority percentage than his/her home school attendance area or (b) a minority student who requests transfer of enrollment to a school which has a lower minority percentage than his/her home school attendance area. Minority percentages for each school attendance area of the District will be established for September 15 or the school day closest to September 15 of each school year and used as the basis for assessing the effect of a proposed transfer until September 15 or the school day closest to September 15 of the next school year.
- D. All applications for transfer of enrollment shall be considered on a "first come, first served" basis. Further, each application for transfer of enrollment shall be evaluated for

its effect upon both the school assigned by residence and the proposed receiving school. The following factors shall be considered when that evaluation is made:

- Class sizes of the proposed receiving school
- The estimated instructional capacity (EIC) of the proposed receiving school
- E. Once a transfer of enrollment has been approved, if the minority percentage of either the home school attendance area or the receiving school attendance area changes from one school year to the next such that the application for transfer for a subsequent year would not be approved, application for transfer of enrollment from fifth, seventh, or eleventh grade students for continuation of enrollment in the same receiving school for which original transfer of enrollment was approved shall be approved subject to the conditions described in Part D and provided the residence of the parent or lawful custodian remains in Unified School District No. 501.
- F. All applications for transfer of enrollment from fifth, seventh, and eleventh grade students to continue enrollment in their home school if the parent or lawful custodian moves to another school attendance area within Unified School District No. 501 shall be approved.
- G. The applicant shall be notified in writing of the approval or denial of his/her application for transfer of enrollment. Approved enrollment transfers are granted for a maximum of one school year or for the balance of a school year; and application must be made annually.
- H. In special circumstances the transfer of enrollment of individual students may be initiated by the Superintendent of Schools or the Superintendent's designee. In each case, placement may be made after conducting an investigation and consulting with the parent or lawful custodian.
- The parent, lawful custodian or other applicant shall accept full responsibility for the transportation of the student to the receiving school if the application for transfer of enrollment is approved.

J. Secondary school students who have been approved for voluntary transfer of enrollment shall be permitted to participate in interscholastic activities in accordance with the Kansas State High School Activities Association regulations.

VI. Non-resident Student Enrollment

- A. Whenever the residence of the person determining the school residence or a student (See Section II, A) is changed to a dwelling outside Unified School District No. 501, and such person desires to maintain the student's current enrollment, a tuition application must be submitted according to Section B below. If the change in residence is made after the end of the first semester, the student may continue to attend that school without payment of tuition contingent upon written notification of change of legal residence prior to the change of residence and approval by the Superintendent of Schools or the Superintendent's designee.
- B. The persons determining school residence (See Section II, A.) of students in grades kindergarten through twelve, who are not legal residents of Unified School District No. 501, may apply for the admission of their student(s) to the District on a tuition basis. Such application shall be reviewed by the Superintendent of Schools or the Superintendent's designee and be either approved or denied. Tuition rates shall be established for each school year by the Superintendent of Schools or the Superintendent of Schools or the Superintendent's designee. The right to assign the school to be attended and to terminate this agreement at any time is retained by the Board of Education.
- C. The Governor and legislators of the State of Kansas may enroll their children in any school within Unified School District No. 501 without the payment of tuition.

ANSWER TO INTERROGATORY NO. 18 a, b & c 1982-83 STUDENT ENROLLMENT TRANSFER POLICY

Policy No. 8025

ENROLLMENT AND ASSIGNMENT OF STUDENTS

- Age Requirements for Entering Head Start, Kindergarten, and Primary First Year Students
 - A. Statutory Requirements
 - K.S.A. 72-1107 establishes the minimum school entrance age for primary first year and kindergarten students. This statute provides:
 - (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b), any child who will attain the age of six years on or before September 1 of any school year shall be eligible to attend the elementary grades in the school district in which the child resides;
 - "(b) any child who has completed a kindergarten course entered and attended in this state in accordance with the provisions of subsection (d) or who was resident in another state and who, while residing in such other state, had entered and was in attendance in first grade in such state or who had completed in such state a kindergarten course maintained by a public school district or by an accredited private, denomonational or parochial school shall be elegible to attend first grade in this state, regardless of age:
 - "(c) in any district maintaining kindergarten, any child who resides in the district and, subject to the provisions of subsection (d), who will attain the age of five years on or before September 1 of any school year shall be eligible to enter kindergarten;
 - "(d) any child who was a resident in another state and who, while residing in such other state had entered and was in attendance in kindergarten in such state shall be eligible to attend kindergarten in this state, regardless of age."
 - Kansas law requires that the student present an immunization certificate at his or her initial enrollment. (K.S.A. 72-5209)
 - B. District Requirements
 - A birth certificate is required as evidence of age upon entering Head Start, kindergarten, or elementary level.
 - 2. Head Start enrollees must be four (4) years old on or before September 1 of the project year.
- II. Residence Requirements for Attendance in District Schools
 - A. Statutory Requirements
 - K.S.A 72-1046 establishes criteria for eligibility to attend schools in this district. This statute provides:
 - "(a) Any child who has attained the age of eligibility for school attendance may attend school in the district in which the child lives if the child

- lives with a resident of the district and the resident is the parent, or a person acting as parent, of the child; or
- "(b) the child lives in the district as result of placement therein by a district court or by the secretary of social and rehabilitation services. As used in this section, the term 'parent' includes step-parents and foster parents; and the term 'person acting as parent' means a legal guardian or a person, other than a parent, who has physical custody of a child and has legal custody of the child, or is by law liable to maintain, care for, or support the child, or is contributing the major portion of the cost of support of the child.
- Any student who is eighteen years of age or older may establish his or her own legal residence within the district pursuant to law.
- III. Student Assignment to Schools Within the District In order to make the optimum use of District school facilities, designated attendance areas for all schools shall be established by the Board of Education. Students residing within the attendance area of a school shall attend that school, except as otherwise provided by policies of the Board of Education. A student who is a minor shall be deemed to reside where the person or persons reside who establish the student's eligibility for attendance in this district. (K.S.A. 72-1046) A student who lives in the district as a result of placement by a district court or the secretary of social and rehabilitation services shall be deemed to reside at the location where so placed.
- IV. Change of Residence Within the District

If the person who establishes a student's eligibility for attendance in this district (K.S.A. 72-1046) moves into the attendance area of another school within this school district during the regular school year, the student may remain enrolled until the end of the regular school year in the schoolin which the student was enrolled immediately prior to the move.

V. Student Enrollment Transfers

- A. If the person determining eligibility of a student for school attendance in this district (K.S.A. 72-2046) desires that the student attend a school other than the residence of such person, a written application for transfer of enrollment to another school shall be submitted to the superintendent of schools or the superintendent's designee, indicating the reason(s) for the application. A separate application must be made for each regular school year. All applications for transfer of enrollment will be reviewed and either approved or denied, pursuant to policies of the Board of Education, by the superintendent of schools or the superintendent's designee.
- B. The initial period of time within which ap-

- plications for transfer of enrollment for the succeeding school year may be made shall be designated annually by the superintendent of schools. Applications for transfer of enrollment at times other than within the designated period are discouraged.
- An application for transfer of enrollment will be approved only for (a) a majority race student who requests transfer of enrollment to a school which has a higher minority race percentage than his/her home attendance area school or (b) minority race student who requests transfer of enrollment to a school which has a lower minority race percentage than his/her home attendance area school. Minority race percentages for each school in the district will be established for September 15, or the school day closest to September 15, of each school year, and such percentages will be used to evaluate proposed transfers of enrollment until new percentages are established for the next school year.
- D. All applications for transfer of enrollment shall be considered on a "first come, first served" basis. Each application for transfer of enrollment shall be evaluated for its effect upon both the school assigned by residence and the proposed receiving school, considering the following factors in addition to those stated elsewhere in Board of Education policies:
 - Class sizes of the sending and proposed receiving school;
 - The estimated instructional capacity (EIC) of the sending and proposed receiving school.
- E. After a transfer of enrollment has been approved, if the minority race percentage of either the home attendance area school or the receiving school changes so that under a subsequent year would not be approved, an application for transfer of enrollment of a fifth, seventh, or eleventh grade student for continuation of enrollment in the receiving school to which original transfer of enrollment was approved shall be approved, subject to the factors stated in subsection D, and provided the residence of the person establishing the student's eligibility for attendance in this district (K.S.A. 72-1046) remains within this school district.
- F. If the person establishing the student's eligibility for attendance in this district moves into the attendance area of another school within this district, an application for transfer of enrollment of a fifth, seventh, or eleventh grade student to continue enrollment in the school attended during the preceding year shall be approved.
- G. The applicant shall be notified in writing of the approval or disapproval of the application for transfer of enrollment.
- H. In special circumstances, the superintendent of schools may place a student in a school other than the school he or she would attend

- under Board of Education policies. Suplacement may be made by the superinte dent of schools after consultation with t person establishing the student's eligibility t attendance in this district and/or the studen parents or guardian.
- If an application for transfer of enrollment approved, the person establishing a studen eligibility for attendance in this district sha have full responsibilty for the transportation of the student to the receiving school.
- J. Secondary school students who have been a proved for voluntary transfer of enrollme shall be permitted to participate in a terscholastic activities in accordance wiregulations of the Kansas State High School Activities Association.

VI. Nonresident Student Enrollment

- Whenever a student no longer lives with resident of this district or in this district as result of placement by a district court or th secretary of social and rehabilitation service and such person, the court or the secretar desires to maintain the student's current enrollment in the district, a tuition applietion must be submitted pursuant to subsection B below. However, if the change in residence is made after the first semester of any school year, the student may continue to attend the school for the remainder of the school year without payment of tuition, subject to writ ten notification of his or her change of residence prior to the change, and approval of continued attendance by the superintenden of schools or the superintendent's designee.
- If a student is not entitled to attend school in this district pursuant to K.S.A. 72-1046, th person having legal custody of the studen may apply for admission of the student to th schools of the district on a tuition basis. Sucl application shall be reviewed by the superin tendent of schools or the superintendent designee, and shall be either approved o denied. Tuition rates shall be established for each school year by the superintendent of schools or the superintendent's designee Upon approval of an application for enroll ment, the superintendent of schools or the superintendent's designee shall determine the school to be attended by the student. All ma jority nonresident students will be assigned to a school with a percentage of minority stu dents greater than the district-wide percentage of minority students; and all minority nonresident students will be assigned to a school with a percentage of minority student less than the district-wide percentage of minority students. The admission of a student to schools of the district on a tuition basis may be terminated at any time by the Board of Education.
- C. The Governor and legislators of the State of Kansas may enroll their children in any school within the district without the pay ment of tuition.

## *ENROLLMENT AND ASSIGNMENT OF STUDENTS

- Age Requirements for Entering Head Start, Kindergarten, and Primary First Year Students
  - A. Statutory Requirements
    - K.S.A. 72-1107 establishes the minimum school entrance age for primary first year and kindergarten students. This statute provides:
      - (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b), any child who will attain the age of six years on or before September 1 of any school year shall be eligible to attend the elementary grades in the school district in which the child resides;
      - "(b) any child who has completed a kindergarten course entered and attended in this state in accordance with the provisions of subsection (d) or who was resident in another state and who, while residing in such other state, had entered and was in attendance in first grade in such state or who had completed in such state a kindergarten course maintained by a public school district or by an accredited private, denomonational or parochial school shall be elegible to attend first grade in this state, regardless of age:
      - "(c) in any district maintaining kindergarten, any child who resides in the district and, subject to the provisions of subsection (d), who will attain the age of five years on or before September 1 of any school year shall be eligible to enter kindergarten:
      - "(d) any child who was a resident in another state and who, while residing in such other state had entered and was in attendance in kindergarten in such state shall be eligible to attend kindergarten in this state, regardless of age."
      - Kansas law requires that the student present an immunization certificate at his or her initial enrollment. (K.S.A. 72-5209)
    - B. District Requirements
      - A birth certificate is required as evidence of age upon entering Head Start, kindergarten, or elementary level.
      - Head Start enrollees must be four (4) years old on or before September 1 of the project year.
  - Residence Requirements for Attendance in District Schools
    - A. Statutory Requirements
      - K.S.A 72-1046 establishes criteria for eligibility to attend schools in this district. This statute provides:
        - "(a) Any child who has attained the age of eligibility for school attendance may attend school in the district in which the child lives if the child lives with a resident of the district and the resident is the parent, or a person acting as parent, of the child; or
        - "(b) the child lives in the district as result of placement therein by a district court or by the secretary of

social and rehabilitation services. As used in this section, the term 'parent' includes step-parents and foster parents; and the term 'person acting as parent' means a legal guardian or a person, other than a parent, who has physical custody of a child and has legal custody of the child, or is by law liable to maintain, care for, or support the child, or is contributing the major portion of the cost of support of the child."

- Any student who is eighteen years of age or older may establish his or her own legal residence within the district pursuant to law.
- III. Student Assignment to Schools Within the District In order to make the optimum use of District school facilities, designated attendance areas for all schools shall be established by the Board of Education. Students residing within the attendance area of a school shall attend that school, except as otherwise provided by policies of the Board of Education. A student who is a minor shall be deemed to reside where the person or persons reside who establish the student's eligibility for attendance in this district. (K.S.A. 72-1046) A student who lives in the district as a result of placement by a district court or the secretary of social and rehabilitation services shall be deemed to reside at the location where so placed.
- IV. Change of Residence Within the District If the person who establishes a student's eligibility for attendance in this district (K.S.A. 72-1046)

for attendance in this district (K.S.A. 72-1046) moves into the attendance area of another school within this school district during the regular school year, the student may remain enrolled until the end of the regular school year in the schoolin which the student was enrolled immediately prior to the move.

#### V. Student Enrollment Transfers

- A. If the person determining eligibility of a student for school attendance in this district (K.S.A. 72-1046) desires that the student attend a school other than the residence of such person, a written application for transfer of enrollment to another school shall be submitted to the superintendent of schools or the superintendent's designee, indicating the reason(s) for the application. A separate application must be made for each regular school year. All applications for transfer of enrollment will be reviewed and either approved or denied, pursuant to policies of the Board of Education, by the superintendent of schools or the superintendent's designee.
- B. The initial period of time within which applications for transfer of enrollment for the succeeding school year may be made shall be designated annually by the superintendent of schools. Applications for transfer of enrollment at times other than within the designated period are discouraged.
  - 2. An application for transfer of enrollment will be approved only for (a) a majority race student who requests transfer of enrollment to a school which has a higher minority race percentage than his/her home attendance area school or (b) minority race student who requests transfer of enrollment to a school which has a lower minority race percentage than his her home attendance area school.

Minority race percentages for each school in the district will be established for September 15, or the school day closest to September 15, of each school year, and such percentages will be used to evaluate proposed transfers of enrollment until new percentages are established for the next school year.

- D. All applications for transfer of enrollment shall be considered on a "first come, first served" basis. Each application for transfer of enrollment shall be evaluated for its effect upon both the school assigned by residence and the proposed receiving school, considering the following factors in addition to those stated elsewhere in Board of Education policies:
  - Class sizes of the sending and proposed receiving school;
  - The estimated instructional capacity (EIC) of the sending and proposed receiving school.
- F.. After a transfer of enrollment has been approved, if the minority race percentage of either the home attendance area school or the receiving school changes so that under a subsequent year would not be approved, an application for transfer of enrollment of a fifth, seventh, or eleventh grade student for continuation of enrollment in the receiving school to which original transfer of enrollment was approved shall be approved, subject to the factors stated in subsection D, and provided the residence of the person establishing the student's eligibility for attendance in this district (K.S.A. 72-1046) remains within this school district.
- F. If the person establishing the student's eligibility for attendance in this district moves into the attendance area of another school within this district, an application for transfer of enrollment of a fifth, seventh, or eleventh grade student to continue enrollment in the school attended during the preceding year shall be approved.
- C. The applicant shall be notified in writing of the approval or disapproval of the application for transfer of enrollment.
- II. In special circumstances, the superintendent of schools may place a student in a school other than the school he or she would attend under Board of Education policies. Such placement may be made by the superintendent of schools after consultation with the person establishing the student's eligibility for attendance in this district and/or the student's parents or guardian.
- I. If an application for transfer of enrollment is approved, the person establishing a student's eligibility for attendance in this district shall have full responsibilty for the transportation of the student to the receiving school.
- J. Secondary school students who have been approved for voluntary transfer of enrollment shall be permitted to participate in interscholastic activities in accordance with regulations of the Kansas State High School Activities Association.
- K. A student who transfers into a school operated by this district from an elementary or secondary school which is accredited by the Kansas State Board of Education or the comparable governmental agency in another state will be admitted, given credits, and placed at the ap-

propriate grade level as indicated by the records forwarded from the school previously attended.

A student who transfers into a school operated by this district from an elementary or secondary school which is not accredited by the Kansas State Board of Education or the comparable governmental agency in another state will upon admission be placed at the appropriate grade level and be given course credits as determined by a committee appointed by the Superintendent or his designee. The committee will examine and consider the academic records of the student, instructions previously received, the accreditation status of the schools previously attended, the certification of staff of schools previously attended, and any other information deemed relevant by the committee in determining appropriate grade level placement and award of credits. The principal of the receiving school shall have the right to administer standardized or locally prepared proficiency tests to such student to aid the committee in determining the appropriate placement of the student and award of credits.

#### VI. Nonresident Student Enrollment

- A. Whenever a student no longer lives with a resident of this district or in this district as a result of placement by a district court or the secretary of social and rehabilitation services. and such person, the court or the secretary desires to maintain the student's current enrollment in the district, a tuition application must be submitted pursuant to subsection B below. However, if the change in residence is made after the first semester of any school year, the student may continue to attend that school for the remainder of the school year without payment of tuition, subject to written notification of his or her change of residence prior to the change, and approval of continued attendance by the superintendent of schools or the superintendent's designee.
- If a student is not entitled to attend school in this district pursuant to K.S.A. 72-1046, the person having legal custody of the student may apply for admission of the student to the schools of the district on a tuition basis. Such application shall be reviewed by the superintendent of schools or the superintendent's designee, and shall be either approved or denied. Tuition rates shall be established for each school year by the superintendent of schools or the superintendent's designee. Upon approval of an application for enrollment, the superintendent of schools or the superintendent's designee shall determine the school to be attended by the student. All majority nonresident students will be assigned to a school with a percentage of minority students greater than the district-wide percentage of minority students; and all minority nonresident students will be assigned to a school with a percentage of minority students less than the district-wide percentage of minority students. The admission of a student to schools of the district on a tuition basis may be terminated at any time by the Board of Education.
- C. The Governor and legislators of the State of Kansas may enroll their children in any school within the district without the payment of tuition.
