Complementary Educational Programs

The administration and faculty are constantly aware of the need for innovation in ~~classroom~~ instructional programs and teaching techniques. Prepared budgets usually reflect envisioned program changes and student instructional needs. Unfortunately, the divergency between expected appropriations and realized funds reduce significantly innovative efforts.

Florida A & M University has a list of projects financed from sources other than state funds. ^{A discussion of} Some of the major ~~projects~~ ^{projects} and their contribution to the major University educational programs follow:

A. Upward Bound: Florida A & M Conducted one of the 18 pilot programs in 1965-66 and is now in its third year with this program. The program involves a ~~variety~~ ^{variety} of experimental techniques with a variety of Academic and cultural activities. The project has served over 350 students in more than 50 counties in Florida.

This project has provided the University information about its Admissions program, methods of recruiting students, orientation program as well as techniques for generating skills and motivation necessary for student success beyond the high school. Efforts

to remedy poor Academic preparation and ^{negative} personal motivation have proved successful in increasing ^{the} student's promise for acceptance and achievement in a College environment.

B. Multi-occupational Manpower Training & Development. 1

This project was conducted for ~~three~~ ^{two} years, and has offered excellent background information on the hard-core unemployed in this area, their training potential and the follow-up needed to assure them productive employment. Over 300 enrollees have been assisted through this program.

The techniques, procedures, ^{used} ~~and~~ ⁱⁿ problem-solving efforts will be of great benefit to the Technical educational program of the university.

C. National Science Foundation Summer Institutes in Biology & Mathematics.

These two projects were designed to strengthen the subject matter competence of in-service Teachers; to present new principles that would aid these Teachers in the meeting the challenge of present-day subject matter teaching and to increase the abilities of the teacher to motivate qualified students to consider careers in these and related fields.

The experience in planning for and implementing these programs strengthened the ~~understanding~~ Competency of the staff

~~xx~~ Today the nation is ^{here} both white and non-white, is critically and analytically examining the Negro position in American life. Of 20 percent population trends are authoritatively projected into the future within fifteen years Negroes will be in the majority in Detroit, Cleveland, Baltimore, Chicago, St. Louis and possibly Philadelphia.

These changes are causing housing problems of great magnitude. The Negro has long been confined to ghettos, now he wants out and must get more room because of the sheer weight of numbers.

On the labor market the Negro faces many problems. Low educational standards of the masses ~~the~~ plague him. For the past ten years ~~of~~ ~~that~~ unskilled jobs have been evaporating as automation has condemned scores of thousands of middle-aged Negroes to obscurity, or scores of thousands of their youngsters to a future that holds nothing.

Even Negroes of superior education and ability find that they are stymied. Most Americans with leadership urge advancement in private business or industry. Few Negroes have the opportunity so to do. On their educational levels and abilities

I would have you to know that courage is

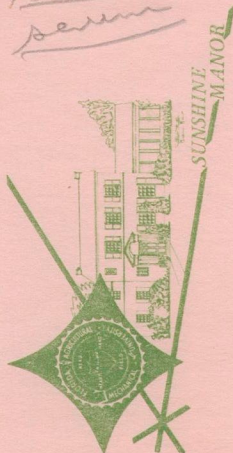

 West Indies for a parade down the famous



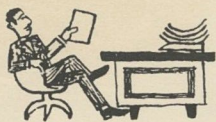

E. The Curriculum Development Program
