TUSKEGEE, Ala.—Funeral services for Dr. Monroe N. Work, director emeritus of the department of records and research at Tuskegee, were held in the institute chapel Friday afternoon. Dr. Work died Wednesday night, May 2, after an illness of several weeks.

Rev. Charles W. Kelly, pastor of the Greenwood Baptist church, was the officiating minister. He was assisted by Rev. Raymond F. Harvey, acting chaplain, Tuskegee Institute.
