PHYSICAL NEEDS

The department lacks even the minimum requirements of equipment for carrying on a successful project. At the beginning of the department, I was informed that \$10,000 would be allocated to equip Lee Hall Auditorium alone. To date only slightly over four thousand dollars have been spent. This went for the purchase of a front curtain, a cyclorama and a few lights.

The department has neither a Little Theatre nor a classroom with a stage which is necessary for classroom instruction in speech and drama. It has no workshop where the laboratory phases of the subject can be taught, built or demonstrated. In the art division of the department, a fine building has been made available but it needs painting and adequate lighting equipment needs to be installed. Show cases and other basic art equipment should be purchased. The Ceramics phase of the program is better equipped than the other two phases. The most important specific needs in the order of their importance are as follows:

Lee Hall Auditorium stays entirely too crowded with programs of all types to be used for the rehearsal as well as the presentation of plays. The Little Theatre could serve as a classroom for large classes, and as a meeting place for small groups, and for programs that attract small audiences. It is absolutely necessary if the work is to grow.

The old laundry is the ideal site for the construction of a Little Theatre. It is near the center of things. It would not make a problem for girls coming to practice at night. I am sure an adequate center could be constructed there for around \$10,000.

- 2. A new control board for controlling the lights in Lee

 Hall Auditorium. A minimum cost would be around \$15,000.

 Additions and replacements for the present one which could serve a little longer, however, could be made for around \$5,000. Patching up this old one is not a good solution, however.
- 3. A trap door cut in the stage of Lee Auditorium with the installation of equipment for a workshop and classroom.

 This would cost around \$3,000.
- 4. A set of scenery for the stage of Lee Auditorium. This would cost around \$1,000.
- 5. Renovating and equiping the Old Carnegie Library for an Art Center. The cost would run around \$2,000.
- 6. Radio equipment has been submitted from the Radio Committee.

With further reference to the statement mentioned above, there are shown balances in several funds which, in our opinion, would be legitimate in using a portion of these balances to liquidate this indebtedness. We are therefore making the following recommendations to transfer the amounts from the funds indicated.

College. I am also enclosing with each financial statement, the box office statement. This is one of the most successful classics that the college has promoted during the period of existence of the college. The attendance was the largest attendance of any classic, although the receipts were not the largest. This was due to a scale down in admission prices for this seasons classic. You will be interested to know that the total sales by the Alumni Association were \$5,643.50. As was agreed, they were to receive 10% of the net cost of each ticket sold by them. This amounted to \$399.64. The tickets sold by the University Ticket Agency totaled \$19,342.75. As agreed upon, they were to receive 3% of the gross. This amounted to \$580.28. Both of these items of expense are shown under expenditures amounting \$24,559 de 979.94. Analyzing the box office statement, I have two recommendations to be made for the next year's classic: 1. That the 50¢ children tickets be eliminated entirely. 2. That the \$1.75 reserve seat tickets be increased to \$2.00. The housing arrangements which was made at the enactivated base through the University of Miami was

especially advantageous in housing our football team and band. We certainly hope that next year barring any unusual circumstances, we will be able to use this base again.

We certainly realize that without the assistance of Mr. Rinehart and Mr. Powers, this classic would not have been as successful as it was, as there were certain advantages which we were able to secure in both the promotion and other areas of operation without there assistance.
