

 - 1. The date of construction
 - 2. The type and description of the addition
 - 3. The cost of construction of the addition and the amount of funds from each source used in the construction
 - 4. The number of students the facility and the addition were designed to accommodate and the increase in student capacity with the facility addition
 - 5. How much additional space was obtained by construction of the addition, and what was the space utilized for
 - 6. Whether the additional capacity was needed to accommodate students transferred from other schools
 - 7. Whether the additional facility was needed to accommodate an increase in enrollment in the school due to increase in student population within the attendance zone for the school
 - 8. State any other reasons for the construction of the additional facilities
- t. Whether portable classrooms have been used by the schools. If the answer is affirmative, state:

Attached hereto is the response of Unified School District No. 501 to subparts a-d, g, o, s & t of Interrogatory No. 9, which was prepared under the direction and supervision of Michael D. Tribbey, Assistant Superintendent of Program Audit and Planning, with the assistance of Ted Clark, Director of Facilities Planning/Transportation, and Gerald Miller, Director of Demographic Services. Also see the answer of Unified School District No. 501 served originally on plaintiff-intervenors on July 3, 1981, which includes much of the information sought by this interrogatory. There were only two schools operated during the 1940 to 1950 time period which were not operated thereafter by Topeka Public Schools. Information regarding those schools, Branner Elementary School which was closed at the conclusion of the 1944-45 school year, and the Branner Annex Elementary School which was closed subsequent to the completion of the 1941-42 school year, is attached hereto.
