The report of William Budd Master in Chancery of this Hon^{ble} Court, who by a decree therein pronounced at an adjourned October Term 1848 of said Court, was duly appointed and authorized to make sale of certain Negro Slaves therein mentioned, and the proceeds of such sale, after deducting the costs, charges and expenses, to pay over to the said complainant in discharge and satisfaction of his said debt. _____

Respectfully shows,.

That in conformity to said decree, said Master in Chancery proceeded to advertise the said Slaves as mentioned therein, from the 29th day of Decem^r 1848 to the 5th day of February 1849, by written advertisements posted up at the Court House Monticello, and three other public places in said County of Jefferson, thereby giving notice of the time and place of sale according to Law. _____

The said Master in Chancery further states, that he proceeded to make sale of said Slaves (8 in number, one of the nine mentioned in said decree, having died sometime back, to wit, Jenny a Girl) at the Court House of Monticello on the first Monday of February 1849 [The 5th day of February 1849] according to said advertisements: That at the said sale, a number of persons were present, and the whole of said Slaves were sold at public Vendue to William Bailey who having bid the most therefor, became the purchaser at the following prices to wit: _____

Hannah, a woman and her six Children to wit:

Edward, Fanny, Louis, Mary, Dennis & Randall for \$ 1625. 00

Harry sold for, 660. 00

in all Two thousand, two hundred and eighty five dollars. — From this sum,

The said Master according to said decree has deducted the costs, charges & expenses of this proceeding paid by him; to wit: C. F. Trices Taxed bill of costs \$ 5 ⁹⁵/₁₀₀: Sibley & Dykes bill advertising \$ 14 ⁰⁰/₁₀₀: W^m. Budd Master in Chancery his bill of costs \$ 23 ³⁵/₁₀₀, makes, \$ 42. 30
