The Legacy of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune

Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune, the founder of Bethune-Cookman College and one of the early pillars in the FSTA, died in 1955. In ~~1955~~ the September issue of the Bulletin carried an editorial entitled "Brick Upon Brick" which called upon members of the FSTA to support a newly established Mary McLeod Bethune ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ Foundation. The Charter of the Foundation stated the purpose as educational and charitable. It further proposed to "provide on the campus of Bethune-Cookman College a cultural heritage to be an inspiration to students in generations to come and one which, while not a part of the College itself, will instill in outsiders who visit it an interest in the things which Mrs. Bethune and the College that she founded, have stood for and still stands for." The Foundation, which is housed in Mrs. Bethune's home, is truly dedicated to achieving better understanding, and good-will on the State, National and International levels.

The editorial pointed out that Dr. Richard V. Moore, a former supervisor of Negro Education in Florida, a staunch supporter of FSTA and presently the president of Bethune-Cookman College would carry forward the noble work that Dr. Bethune had begun.
